WHEREAS, District staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve twenty Educational Service Center Priority and Board Member Priority (BMP) projects (as listed on Attachment A of Board Report No. 215-14/15), and authorize the Chief Facilities Executive, and/or his designee, to make any purchases associated with these projects. The total combined budget for these projects is \$853,671; and

WHEREAS, projects included in the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan presented to the Board of Education were developed by Facilities in consultation with the Complex Project Managers, Regional Facilities Directors, Administrator of Operations, the affected School Principals, and the communities; and

WHEREAS, funding for the 20 Educational Service Center Priority & Board Member Priority Projects will come from Educational Service Center Funds (\$393,805), and, Board Member Priority Funds (\$459,866); and

WHEREAS, District staff has concluded that the proposed SEP amendment will help facilitate implementation of the 2014 FSD SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the projects contained in the SEP.

Action Proposed: Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the

Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve twenty Educational Service Center Priority and Board Member Priority (BMP) projects (as listed on Attachment A), and authorize the Chief Facilities Executive, and/or his designee, to make any purchases associated

with these projects. The total combined budget for these projects is

\$853,671.

Background: In accordance with the Maintenance and Operations Weighted Allocation

Formula, local Bond Measures K, R and Y funds have been allocated to Board-Prioritized Facilities Programs for ESC and BMP projects. Projects are developed at the discretion of the Board District or Educational Service Center with support from Facilities Services Division staff and input from school administrators. All projects must be capital in nature and adhere to

bond language and laws.

The projects proposed in this Board Report will upgrade, modernize and/or enhance the learning environment for students. The projects include various modernization, technology, security upgrade and repair scopes of work. Project scopes, schedules and budgets within these categories may vary

depending on site conditions and needs.

Expected Outcomes: Execution of these projects will help improve the learning environment for

students, teachers and staff.

Board Options and Consequences:

A "yes" vote will allow staff to execute the projects listed on Attachment A.

Failure to approve this proposed action will delay the projects and

ultimately the anticipated benefit to the schools and their students.

Policy Implications: The requested actions are consistent with the Board-Prioritized Facilities

Programs for ESC and BMP projects and the District's commitment to address unmet school facilities needs and provide students with a safe and

healthy learning environment.

Budget Impact: The total combined budget for the twenty projects is \$853,671. Ten projects

are funded by Bond Program funds allocated for BMP projects. The

remaining ten projects are funded by Bond Program funds allocated for ESC

projects.

that have been deemed critical by Board Members and/or Administrators of

Operations and school administrators.
