BOARD REPORT NO. 121-15/16

**AMENDMENT TO THE FACILITIES SERVICES DIVISION STRATEGIC
EXECUTION PLAN TO DEFINE AND APPROVE 10 BOARD MEMBER
PRIORITY AND LOCAL DISTRICT PRIORITY PROJECTS**

WHEREAS, District staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve 10 Local District Priority (LDP) and Board Member Priority (BMP) projects (as listed on Attachment A of Board Report No. 121-15/16), and authorize the Chief Facilities Executive, and/or his designee, to make any purchases associated with these projects. The total combined budget for these projects is \$753,028; and

WHEREAS, projects included in the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan presented to the Board of Education were developed by Facilities in consultation with the Complex Project Managers, Regional Facilities Directors, Administrator of Operations, the affected School Principals, and the communities, and

WHEREAS, funding for the 10 Local District Priority and Board Member Priority Projects will come from Alteration and Improvement Funds (\$444,361), and Board Member Priority Funds (\$308,667); and

WHEREAS, District staff has concluded that the proposed SEP Amendment will help facilitate implementation of the FSD SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the FSD SEP.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee (BOC) recommends that the Board of Education adopt an amendment to the

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AND LOCAL DISTRICT PRIORITY PROJECTS
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Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan, to add nine Local District Priority projects and Board Member Priority projects within Local Districts Northeast, Northwest, East, West, South and Central such that the Strategic Execution Plan is amended to include the nine LDP and BMP Projects described in Board Report No. 121-15/16 a copy of which is attached hereto in the form it was presented to the BOC and is incorporated herein by reference.

2. The BOC resolves hereby that it will not make any recommendations, either for or against, BMP and Local District Priority information technology projects until after the BOC Task Force studying the use of bond funds for information technology projects reports back to the BOC. Accordingly, the BOC makes no recommendation to the Board of Education on the proposed Gulf Avenue Elementary School Chromebook project at a proposed cost of \$40,896, a BMP project included in Board Report No. 121-15/16. The BOC affirmatively recommends only the remaining nine projects in Board Report No. 121-15/16 with a total combined budget of \$712,132.
3. This resolution shall be transmitted to the Los Angeles Unified School District Board of Education and posted on the Oversight Committee's website.
4. That a written response as required by the Charter and Memorandum of Understanding between the Oversight Committee and the Board be provided to the Oversight Committee within 30 days, reporting either on action taken or proposed to be taken in response to this resolution and each recommendation herein.





BOARD REPORT

Action Proposed: Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve 10 Local District Priority (LDP) and Board Member Priority (BMP) projects (as listed on Attachment A), and authorize the Chief Facilities Executive, and/or his designee, to make any purchases associated with these projects. The total combined budget for these projects is \$753,028.

Background: In accordance with the Maintenance and Operations Weighted Allocation Formula, local Bond Measures K, R and Y funds have been allocated to Board-Prioritized Facilities Programs for LDP and BMP projects. Projects are developed at the discretion of the Board District or Local District with support from Facilities Services Division staff and input from school administrators. All projects must be capital in nature and adhere to bond language and laws.

The projects proposed in this Board Report will upgrade, modernize and/or enhance the learning environment for students. The projects include various modernization, security upgrade and repair scopes of work. Project scopes, schedules and budgets within these categories may vary depending on site conditions and needs.

Expected Outcomes: Execution of these projects will help improve the learning environment for students, teachers and staff.

Board Options and Consequences: A “yes” vote will allow staff to execute the projects listed on Attachment A. Failure to approve this proposed action will delay the projects and ultimately the anticipated benefit to the schools and their students.



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Board of Education Report

Policy Implications:	The requested actions are consistent with the Board-Prioritized Facilities Programs for Local District Priority and Board Member Priority projects and the District's commitment to address unmet school facilities needs and provide students with a safe and healthy learning environment.
Budget Impact:	The total combined budget for the 10 projects is \$753,028. Four projects are funded by Bond Program funds allocated for Board Member Priority projects. Six projects are funded by Bond Program funds allocated for Local District Priority projects.
Issues and Analysis:	This report includes a number of time-sensitive, small to medium-sized projects that have been deemed critical by Board Members and/or Local Districts and school administrators.
Bond Oversight Committee Recommendations:	These items were considered by the School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee (BOC) at its meeting on October 29, 2015. Staff has concluded that this proposed FSD-SEP amendment will help facilitate implementation of the FSD-SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the FSD-SEP.
