AMENDMENT TO THE FACILITIES SERVICES DIVISION STRATEGIC EXECUTION PLAN TO DEFINE AND APPROVE FOUR PROJECTS THAT ADDRESS CRITICAL SCHOOL REPAIR NEEDS

WHEREAS, District Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve four projects that address critical school repair needs with a combined budget of \$9,819,926 (collectively, the "Project") as described in Board Report 00008-16/17 attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, on February 14, 2014, the Board of Education approved the establishment of the School Upgrade Program (SUP), the next phase of the District's Bond Program which will modernize, build and repair school facilities to improve student health, safety and educational quality; and

WHEREAS, the SUP includes a spending target to address "Critical School Repair and Safety Improvements to School Building Components"; and

WHEREAS, District Staff has determined that the Project is necessary to improve student health, safety and educational quality; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education's approval of the Project will authorize District Staff to proceed with the expenditure of bond funds to undertake the Projects in accordance with the provisions set forth in Measures K, R, Y and Q; and

- 3. The District is directed to track the above recommendation and to report on the adoption, rejection, or pending status of the recommendations as provided in section 6.2 of the Charter and Memorandum of Understanding between the Oversight Committee and the District.

Amendment to the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan to Define and Approve Four Projects that Address Critical School Repair Needs August 23, 2016
Facilities Services Division

Action Proposed:

Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve four projects that address critical school repair needs. The scope, schedule and budget for the four proposed projects are described in Attachment A. The total combined budget for the four projects is \$9,819,926.

Background:

On January 14, 2014, the Board of Education approved the establishment of the School Upgrade Program (SUP), the next phase of the District's Bond Program which will modernize, build and repair school facilities to improve student health, safety and educational quality. The Board's action approved the overarching goals and principles, funding sources, specific categories of need, and spending targets for the SUP.

The SUP includes a spending target to address "Critical School Repair and Safety Improvements to School Building Components." Projects developed under these categories of need are included in the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan.

The four proposed projects that address critical school repair are necessary to improve student health, safety and educational quality.

Expected Outcomes:

Staff anticipates that the Board of Education will approve the proposed action to define and approve four projects to address critical school repair needs that will improve student health, safety and educational quality.

Board Options and Consequences:

A "yes" vote will authorize staff to proceed with the expenditure of bond funds to undertake the four proposed projects in accordance with the provisions set forth in Measures K, R, Y and Q. If the proposed action is not approved, bond funds will not be expended and critical school repair needs will remain unaddressed.

Policy Implications:

These actions are consistent with the District's commitment to address unmet school facilities needs and provide students with a safe and healthy learning environment.

Budget Impact:

The total combined budget for the four projects is \$9,819,926. The projects will be funded with Bond Program funds earmarked specifically for critical school repair and safety improvements to school building components.

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Issues and Analysis:

It may be necessary to undertake feasibility studies, site analysis, scoping, and/or due diligence activities on the proposed projects prior to initiating design. As necessary, the Office of Environmental Health and Safety (OEHS) will evaluate the proposed projects in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to ensure compliance. If through the planning and design process it is determined that the proposed project scope(s) will not sufficiently address the critical need identified, the project scope, schedule and budget will be revised accordingly.

Bond Oversight Committee Recommendations:

This item was considered by the School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee (BOC) at its meeting on August 18, 2016. Staff has concluded that this proposed FSD SEP amendment will facilitate implementation of the FSD SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the FSD SEP.

1. Banning High School – Project to Replace Synthetic Turf Field

Local District South, Board District 7 - Vladovic

- Project Background and Scope This project is to replace approximately 104,000 square feet of
 deteriorated synthetic turf field, and the cleaning of field drainage and repair irrigation for
 cooling. The warranty for the existing turf expired in 2015.
- *Project Budget* -- \$2,290,389
- *Project Schedule* Construction is anticipated to begin in Q3 2017 and conclude in Q2 2018.

2. Calabash Elementary School – Project to Replace Playground Paving

Local District Northwest, Board District 4 - Zimmer

- Project Background and Scope This project is to replace approximately 162,000 square feet of deteriorated asphaltic concrete (AC) paving at the playground and kindergarten yard areas which presents a safety/tripping hazard. Access compliance work such as the replacement of 890 square feet of AC paving for handicap parking will be performed. This project includes best management practices to control rainwater flow within the site.
- *Project Budget* -- \$2,960,562
- Project Schedule Construction is anticipated to begin in Q3 2018 and conclude in Q1 2020.

3. Dodson Middle School – Project to Replace Paver Blocks

Local District South, Board District 7 - Vladovic

- Project Background and Scope This project is to replace approximately 9,500 square feet of
 deteriorated paver blocks at the school quad. Existing pavers pose a tripping hazard for students
 and staff. The scope of work also includes the replacement of approximately 230 linear feet of
 concrete curb.
- *Project Budget* -- \$437,734
- Project Schedule Construction is anticipated to begin in Q4 2016 and conclude in Q2 2017.

4. Eagle Rock High School – Project to Provide Seismic Retrofit for Practice Gymnasium Building

Local District Central, Board District 5 – Rodriguez

- Project Background and Scope This 14,565 square foot gym was built in 1977 and will require
 upgrades to structural connections at the roof, wall, and foundation to meet current seismic
 requirements.
- *Project Budget* -- \$4,131,241
- *Project Schedule* Construction is anticipated to begin in Q2 2018 and conclude in Q4 2019.
