Amendment to the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan to Define and Approve Six Projects that Address Critical School Repair Needs
November 13, 2018
Facilities Services Division

Action Proposed:

Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve six projects that address critical school repair needs, as listed on Attachment A. Staff further proposes that the Board authorize the Chief/Deputy Procurement Officer and/or the Chief Facilities Executive and/or their designee(s) to execute all instruments necessary, as legally permissible, to implement the proposed projects, including budget modifications and the purchase of equipment and materials. The total combined budget for the six projects is \$10,094,343.

Background:

The District encompasses approximately 1,300 different schools and centers, and Facilities is responsible for maintaining, repairing, and upgrading more than 13,500 school buildings, the majority of which are over 50 years old. Despite the significant investments the District has made in its school facilities over the last two decades, schools continue to age and deteriorate and older buildings may not align with instructional requirements. As the District's capital needs far exceed available funding, priorities for the expenditure of capital funding must be evaluated to ensure the District's most pressing priorities are being addressed.

Based on an evaluation of known facilities conditions and needs at schools, the following have been identified as the most pressing unfunded critical school repair and safety needs that should continue to be addressed within the limited available funding:

- Failing, deteriorated, and outdated building systems and components
- School buildings, rooms and/or facilities deemed unsafe for occupancy
- Other critical health and safety concerns, urgent/emergency conditions, and/or health and safety code compliance issues that may arise

The project proposals contained in this Board Report align with the identified types of pressing critical school repair and safety conditions. The projects consist of roofing, flooring and synthetic turf replacement projects. Attachment A provides additional details pertaining to the proposed projects.

Expected Outcomes:

Staff anticipates that the Board of Education will approve the proposed action to define and approve six projects to address critical school repair needs that will improve student health, safety and educational quality.

Board Options and Consequences:

A "yes" vote will authorize staff to proceed with the expenditure of bond funds to undertake the project proposals in accordance with the provisions set forth in Measures K, R, Y and Q. If the proposed action is not approved, bond funds will not be expended and critical school repair needs will remain unaddressed.

Policy Implications:

The action is consistent with the District's commitment to address unmet school facilities needs and provide students with a safe and healthy learning environment. Moreover, the proposal is aligned with the Board-adopted Facilities Bond Program strategy to address unfunded and pressing school facilities needs related to safety, compliance, and instructional requirements (Board Report No. 048-17/18).

Budget Impact:

The total combined budget for the six projects is \$10,094,343. The projects will be funded with Bond Program funds earmarked specifically for critical school repair and safety improvements to school building components.

Each project budget was prepared based on the current information known, and assumptions about, the project scope, site conditions, and market conditions. Individual project budgets will be reviewed throughout the planning, design, and construction phases as new information becomes known or unforeseen conditions arise, and will be adjusted accordingly to enable the successful completion of each project.

Student Impact:

Continuing our efforts to undertake critical school repair and safety improvement projects is a vital component to the District's ability to provide safe school environments that promote teaching and learning.

Issues and Analysis:

It may be necessary to undertake feasibility studies, site analysis, scoping, and/or due diligence activities on the proposed projects prior to initiating design. As necessary, the Office of Environmental Health and Safety (OEHS) will evaluate the proposed projects in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) to ensure compliance. If through the planning and design process it is determined that the proposed project scope(s) will not sufficiently address the critical need identified, the project scope, schedule and budget will be revised accordingly.

Bond Oversight Committee Recommendations:

This item was considered by the BOC at its meeting on November 1, 2018. Staff has concluded that this proposed FSD SEP amendment will facilitate implementation of the FSD SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the FSD SEP.

 irrigation systems and cleaning the existing field drainage and providing irrigation repairs.

- *Project Schedule* Construction is anticipated to begin in Q1 2019 and conclude in Q2 2019.

4. Fremont High School – Project to Provide New Synthetic Turf Field

 deteriorated synthetic turf at the football field. The scope of work includes cleaning the existing field
 drainage system and providing irrigation repairs.
