WHEREAS, District Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to update the walk-in freezer modernization program at 306 school sites with a combined budget of \$47,226,181, as described in Board Report 092-18/19 attached hereto; and authorize the Chief/Deputy Procurement Officer and/or the Chief Facilities Executive and/or their designee(s), to execute all instruments necessary to implement the program; and

WHEREAS, the School Upgrade Program includes a spending target to "Modernize and Repair School Cafeterias to Make Nutritious Healthy Meals Available to More Students;" and

WHEREAS, on March 8, 2016, the Board approved a program to upgrade walk-in freezers Districtwide (Board Report No. 284-15/16); and

WHEREAS, District Staff determined it was necessary to increase the level of work required to achieve the goal of providing modern, energy efficient walk-in freezers that enable schools to provide safe, healthy and nutritional meals to students; and

WHEREAS, adjustments were made to budgets and construction schedules to align with the refined scope requirements; and

WHEREAS, the proposal adds nine sites to the program where walk-in freezers are deteriorated and beyond economical repair, and removes eight sites where walk-in freezers are being addressed by other Board-approved projects or had been otherwise repaired; and

- 1. The School Construction Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee recommends that the Board of Education adopt an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to update the walk-in freezer modernization program at 306 school sites with a combined budget of \$47,226,181, as described in Board Report 092-18/19, a copy of which is attached hereto in the form it was presented to the BOC and is incorporated herein by reference.

Update to the Walk-in Freezer Modernization Program November 13, 2018 Facilities Services Division and Food Services Division

Action Proposed:

Staff proposes that the Board of Education (Board) amend the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan (FSD-SEP) to update the walk-in freezer modernization program at 306 school sites (Attachment A). Staff further proposes that the Board authorize the Chief/Deputy Procurement Officer and/or the Chief Facilities Executive and/or their designee(s) to execute all instruments necessary, as legally permissible, to implement the program, including budget modifications and the purchase of equipment and materials.

The total combined budget for the 306 projects included in the program is \$47,226,181, which includes an increase of \$26,726,181. The budget increase is due to an increase in the level of work required to achieve the goal of the projects: to provide modern, energy efficient walk-in freezers that enable schools to provide safe, healthy and nutritional meals to students.

Background:

The District's walk-in freezers are deteriorated, energy-inefficient, and may pose health and safety concerns. Outdated walk-in freezers are costly to maintain and operate, and frequently break down, which poses food safety and sanitation hazards. Modernizing walk-in freezers that are well beyond their useful life will help ensure nutritional meals are readily available. Furthermore, modernized walk-in freezers are more efficient to operate, which will reduce energy consumption costs and the impact on the environment.

On March 8, 2016, the Board approved a program to upgrade walk-in freezers Districtwide for a total combined budget of \$20,500,000 (Board Report No. 284-15/16). Initially it was assumed that select interior systems and components of the walk-in freezers could be repaired or retained. However, as staff began the execution of the projects, they discovered the level of deterioration of the various systems and equipment was much greater than initially anticipated. Further evaluation by staff concluded that more extensive upgrades were necessary to appropriately address the deteriorated conditions and that a complete replacement of the units' interior, and refrigeration and lighting systems was required. Based on these scope requirements, construction proceeded at several sites, which helped determine an appropriate budget for each site. Once the program-wide scope was refined, adjustments were made to align budgets and construction schedules for all projects in the program.

Of the original 305 sites (Board Report No. 284-15/16), eight sites do not require stand-alone walk-in freezer projects as they are being addressed by other Board-approved projects or had been repaired; as such, those sites (93rd Street ES, Ascot ES, Belvedere MS, Burroughs MS, Cleveland HS, Polytechnic HS, San Pedro HS and Rancho Dominguez HS) will be removed from the program. In addition, the Food Services Division has identified nine sites not on the original list where the walk-in freezers are deteriorated and beyond economical repair (Barrett ES, Carpenter Community Charter ES, Carson ES, Harding ES, Irving STEAM Magnet MS, Loma Vista ES, Pinewood ES, Ride ES (Smart Academy) and Rowan ES). These sites have been added to the program which now comprises 306 sites (Attachment A).

Expected Outcomes:

Staff anticipates that the Board of Education will approve the proposed update to the walk-in freezer modernization program to address food services facilities needs that will improve student health, safety and educational quality.

Board Options and Consequences:

Approval of this proposal will authorize staff to proceed with the expenditure of Bond Program funds to modernize walk-in freezers in accordance with the provisions set forth in Measures K, R, Y and Q. If the proposed action is not approved, staff would not be authorized to proceed with the scope of work deemed necessary to execute the program at 306 school sites, and thus food services facilities needs will remain unaddressed.

Policy Implications:

These actions are consistent with the District's commitment to address unmet school facilities needs and provide students with a safe and healthy learning environment.

Budget Impact:

The initial approval of the Food Services walk-in freezer modernization program had an overall budget of \$20,500,000. With this update, an additional \$26,726,181 will be allocated to the projects for an overall combined budget of \$47,226,181. The program will be funded by Bond funds targeted in the School Upgrade Program for the modernization and repair of school cafeterias. Individual project budgets can be seen in Attachment A.

Student Impact:

Staff's proposal will upgrade and modernize outdated, deteriorated and energy-inefficient walk-in freezers which may pose health and safety concerns. Modernizing walk-in freezers that are well beyond their useful life will help to make nutritional meals available, and thus improve student health, safety and educational quality.

Issues and Analysis:

Due to the increase in the work required, the program duration has been revised and completion of all sites is now expected by Q4 2022. To date, walk-in freezers upgrades have been completed at 36 sites. According to a study completed by the M&O Sustainability Initiatives Unit, when all 306 sites are completed, the new energy efficient equipment will reduce the District's utility bills by \$2,175,000 per year.

Bond Oversight Committee Recommendations:

This item was considered by the School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee ("BOC") at its meeting on November 1, 2018. Staff has concluded that the proposed amendment to the FSD-SEP will help facilitate implementation of the SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the SEP.
