

MAJOR CHANGES

Below are the major changes for the 2022-23 school year:

- The average class size in grades 4-5(6) for non-high needs non-PHBAO magnet schools and centers will be reduced by .50 student.
- The average class in grades 4-5(6) for all other magnet schools and centers will be the same as those
 in place in FY 2021-22.
- The average class size in grades 6-8 for all non-high needs middle magnet schools and centers will be reduced by 3 students.
- The average class size in grades 6-8 for all high needs middle magnet schools and centers will be reduced by 1 student.
- The average class size in grades 9-12 for all senior magnet schools and centers will be reduced by 3 students.
- PHBAO high needs and non-high needs magnet middle schools will not receive additional allocation for auxiliaries for Intensive Intervention English Programs in FY 2022-23, since the district class size for these schools is lower than the 28:1 class size required for the program.
- All elementary, middle, and senior high magnet schools and centers will reach the district target class sizes in FY 2022-23; therefore, high needs and non-high needs schools and centers will use the same norm tables.
- Per Article XVIII, Section 2.0 of the LAUSD-UTLA agreement dated January 2019, PHBAO and non-PHBAO magnet schools and centers will have the following average class sizes in FY 2022-23.

GUIDELINES TEACHERS

- The teacher staffing ratios for grades TK-3 will be the same as those in place for the 2021-22 school year.
- For Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) reporting purposes, enumerated below is the determination of the funding or program code to be used for the norm teacher resources generated by the following norm tables:

Appendix 1 – Various norm tables for all magnet schools and magnet centers.

Appendix 2 – Various norm tables for the 2017-18 Class Size for all Schools (Base)

- a) The norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-12 in Appendix 3 (Attachments A B) will be allocated in program code 13027 (General Fund School Program).
- b) The difference between the norm teacher resources generated using the staffing ratios reduced in Appendix 1 (Attachments A & B) and the norm teacher resources generated from the 2017-18 class size for grades 4-12 in Appendix 3 (Attachments A and B) will be allocated in program code 10989 (TSP-CSR Teacher/Librarian).
- Norm Enrollment Adjustments As in the past, the following adjustments will be applied to Norm Day Enrollment for the 2022-23 school year:
 - Age ineligible students who are:
 - enrolled as Kindergarten (K) or Transitional Kindergarten (TK) but turn 5 years old after February 2, 2022, or
 - o enrolled as grade TE but turn 5 years old after September 1, 2023
- Students with more than one enrollment record (duplicate students)
- Students enrolled in one course only

The classification report provides counts of students with scheduled class(es) in their school of enrollment. For norm purposes, the classification report counts will be reduced to count only those students who are scheduled in two or more credit-bearing courses. Therefore, school should ensure that each student's complete schedule is entered into MiSiS in time for the Norm capture. Refer to Attachment D for the list of non-credit bearing/zero credit courses.



- No Show students (students who are scheduled into classes but have not attended school, i.e., marked absent each day) who were not flagged by the schools in MiSiS as No Show by Norm Day data capture will be manually deducted from the school's enrollment count.
- In addition to ensuring that students are both enrolled and scheduled in MiSiS, school must also ensure that students are enrolled in the:
 - Appropriate cost center (i.e., home school versus magnet center or dual language center).
 Students approved to be enrolled at the magnet center must be enrolled at the magnet center's cost center unless documentation exists to rescind magnet placement.
 - Correct class(es) based on the student's IEP, if applicable.
 - School staff must correct all enrollment errors, including incorrect cost center and class(es),
 before enrollment counts are captured for norm day, September 16, 2022.
- The SDP counts are modified when section assignments for students differed than what was called for in the Individualized Education Programs (IEPs).
- Special Day Program (SDP) students at Elementary School

Students enrolled in the class/section of a Special education teacher are categorized in the Classification Report as SDP. The total SDP counts are excluded in the calculation of general education norm teachers.

Special education teachers are assigned to elementary schools based on the number of students with special needs and their specific disabilities. Refer to Attachment C for the Special Education norm table guide. These class sizes are based on the Los Angeles Unified School District and United Teachers Los Angeles Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Secondary SDP Student Count

Secondary students with an active Individualized Education Program (IEP) where the Percent Time in Special Ed is 50% or more are counted as SDP in the Classification Report. Moreover, SDP counts are modified when section assignments for students differed than what was called for in the IEPs.

The total SDP counts are excluded in the calculation of General education norm teachers. Special education teachers are assigned to middle and senior high schools based on the number of students with special needs and their specific disabilities. Refer to Attachment E for the Special Education norm table guide. These class sizes are based on the Los Angeles Unified School District and United Teachers Los Angeles Collective Bargaining Agreement.



Pursuant to Education Code section 42238.02, as a condition of receiving a grade span adjustment
for kindergarten through grade three (K-3 GSA), a component of Local Control Funding Formula
(LCFF), school districts must make progress towards or maintain a K-3 maximum average class
size of 24 or less at each school site. If the annual independent audit of a school district shows
that a school district did not comply with these conditions, the California Department of
Education (CDE) will retroactively reduce the school district's funding.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten, 32 in grades 1-3 at any time, and 36 in grades 4-6.

Note: These limits also apply to "combination" classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the district because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.

Staffing Position Simulator

"Staffing Position Simulator" tool is available on the School Fiscal Services website (http://achieve.lausd.net/Page/794). The purpose of this tool is to provide schools with transparency as to how Norm Teacher counts are calculated based on their enrollment, Norm Category, and Affiliated Charter status. In addition to the Norm Teacher count, this tool will also calculate the number of Counselor, Administrator, and Clerical norm positions. Schools can also use the tool to assist with the norm calculation during the budget planning and development.

After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For teachers, new positions will be established based on enrollment growth, or existing positions will be closed based on enrollment decline.

FY 2022-23 norm tables for different norm categories reflected on Attachment A and B are based on total school enrollment, excluding elementary students categorized as SDP in the Classification Report and secondary students with an active IEP where the Percent Time in Special Ed is 50% or more.



- A. Magnet Schools and Centers identified as Predominantly Hispanic, Black, Asian and Other Non-Anglo Students (PHBAO) use Attachment A to determine teacher allocations.
- B. Magnet Schools and Centers identified as non-PHBAO use Attachment B to determine teacher allocations.
- C. Double Block English Courses for grades 6-8 for selected magnet middle schools (Attachment A, Table 5P and Attachment B, Table 5D) and Double Block English Courses for 9th grade for selected magnet high schools (Attachment A, Table 6P and Attachment B, Table 6D).

The teacher staffing ratios for the Intensive Intervention English Language Arts program (English core class with Literacy for Success for magnet middle schools] in grades 6-8 for non-PHBAO high needs schools will be reduced by 1 student.

The teacher staffing ratios for the Intensive Intervention English Language Arts program (English core class with Literacy for Success for magnet middle schools] in grades 6-8 for non-PHBAO non-high needs schools will be reduced by 3 students.

PHBAO high needs and non-high needs middle schools will not receive an allocation for Double Block English Courses for grades 6-8 in FY 2022-23, since the district class size for these schools is lower than the 28:1 required for the course.

The teacher staffing ratios for Strategic Literacy program [magnet high school] in grades 9-12 for all schools will be reduced by 3 students.

ADMINISTRATORS

- o The administrator staffing will be the same as those in place for the 2021-22 school year.
- The Assistant Principal positions will be allocated in program code 10332 (TSP-Norm AP & APSCS).
- The allocation of norm administrative position(s) for Span Magnet Schools will be based on the total school-wide enrollment, including transitional kindergarten expansion, special day program classes (SDP), state preschool (SPS), pre-kindergarten special education using the Middle/Senior High School Administrative Staffing table.
- After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For administrators, growth positions are allocated but reductions are not implemented.



Elementary Magnet Schools

Administrative personnel for elementary magnet schools are allocated using the table below and the total school-wide enrollment, including Transitional Kindergarten Expansion program, special day program classes (SDP), state preschool (SPS), pre-kindergarten special education.

- Starting FY 2021-22, the allocation of norm counselor positions for Span Magnet Schools is based on the Middle and Senior High Schools Staffing table displayed below using the total secondary enrollment, including enrollment in special day classes (SDP).
- The counselors at senior high schools and span schools will be allocated in program 14858 (TSP- HS Couns School).
- After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For counselors, new positions will be established based on enrollment growth, or existing positions will be closed based on enrollment decline.

Secondary Magnet Schools

Counseling positions for all middle and senior magnet high schools are allocated using the table below and the total school-wide enrollment, including special day program classes (SDP).

K-8 Span Schools will use the Middle Magnet School Clerical Staffing table. 6-12 and K-12 Span Schools will use the Senior High Magnet School Clerical Staffing table.
- Starting in 2020-21 fiscal year, the Modified Consent Decree clerical position has been changed to "Special Education Section Clerical Support". Sites do not have flexibility over this position.
- After Norm Day, school resources are recalculated based on validated Norm Day enrollment, and schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in resources. For clerical support, growth positions are allocated but reductions are not implemented.

The 2022-23 norm table provides one position for every 24 students based on total enrollment in grades K-3 classes. To prevent loss of Local Control Funding Formula K through 3 Grade Span Adjustment funding, the school district must maintain a maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site.

A class with 4th, 5th, or 6th grade students combined with any K-3 students is considered a K-3 class. Therefore, maximum average class size is 24. Attendance & Enrollment Section captures school month end enrollments for compliance with K-3 class size guidelines and will work with Local District in monitoring of class sizes.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten and 32 in grades 1-3.

Note: These limits also apply to "combination" classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the district because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.

The 2022-23 norm table provides one position for every 24 students based on total enrollment in grades K-3 classes. To prevent loss of Local Control Funding Formula K through 3 Grade Span Adjustment funding, the school district must maintain a maximum average class size of 24 or less at each school site.

A class with 4th, 5th, or 6th grade students combined with any K-3 students is considered a K-3 class. Therefore, maximum average class size is 24. Attendance & Enrollment Section captures school month end enrollments for compliance with K-3 class size guidelines and will work with Local District in monitoring of class sizes.

The Education Code imposes financial penalties on school districts that exceed specified class sizes. To safeguard against financial penalties, the number of pupils assigned to individual classes may not exceed 33 in kindergarten and 32 in grades 1-3.

Note: These limits also apply to "combination" classes. For purposes of the Class Size Penalties report to the California Department of Education, any class combining pupils in kindergarten or in any grade(s) 4 through 8 with one or more of Grades 1, 2, or 3 shall be considered a class of grades 1, 2, or 3. For example, if five (5) grade 3 pupils are added to a grade 4 class of 28, the class would be considered a grade 3 class of 33. In this example, a fiscal penalty would be assessed on the district because the class exceeded the class size requirement of 32 for grade 3.
