The district uses the Targeted Instructional Improvement Block Grant (TIIG) resources to fund class size reduction positions for PHBAO and Non-PHBAO schools to meet the district's required class sizes by grade span and norm category. Since fiscal year 2013-2014, these resources have been a part of the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds that the district receives from the state.

The TIIG resources for Affiliated Charter Schools that began operations prior to fiscal year 2013-14 are included in the Charter School Categorical Block Grant (Program 13723) that they receive annually. Therefore, these Affiliated Charter Schools, including their dual language centers, are not eligible for class size reduction positions funded by District resources. These schools are responsible for funding the class size reduction position required to meet the bargained class sizes using the allocation in Program 13723.

TIIG resources in Program 13723 are used to fund the class size reduction positions, which is the *difference* between the district norm tables and the PHBAO or Non-PHBAO norm tables.

For Example: The teacher staffing ratio for grades 4-5 for a PHBAO elementary school is 27:1. Therefore, A PHBAO Affiliated Charter Elementary School with a total enrollment count of 130 students in grades 4-5 would need 5 teaching positions to meet the required class size. The district will fund 4 teaching positions based on the 35.5 district norm for grades 4-5, and the school is required to fund one additional position using the Charter School Categorical Block Grant (Program 13723) allocation to reduce the class size from 35.5 to 27.

Norm Day Settle-Up Scenarios for TIIG CSR Teachers in Program 13723-Categorical Block Grant

District-funded Norm and TIIG-funded class size reduction positions are funded during budget development based on E-CAST enrollment. After Norm Day, staffing is recalculated based on validated actual enrollment numbers. Schools may experience no change, an increase, or a decrease in teaching positions and/or TIIG-funded class size reduction positions. Whether the District or the school is required to fund the teacher positions, the funding change will be retroactive to July 1.

Scenario 1 - No change between E-CAST and Norm Day in the number of district-funded norm-generated and TIIG-funded class size reduction teacher positions.

During Budget Development a school with E-CAST enrollment of 277 students in grades 4-5 needed 9 teaching positions to meet the 32.5 non-PHBAO class size. It received 8 district-funded positions using the 35.5 district norm and funded 1 class size reduction position from its Categorical Block Grant Program 13723 to reduce the ratio to 32.5 to meet the non-PHBAO class size requirement. On Norm Day, the school's actual enrollment declined to 265 students; however, the number of positions required to meet the class size of 32.5:1 and the number of district-funded Norm positions to meet 35.5:1 remained the same.

Scenario 2: An increase on Norm Day in the number of norm-generated class size reduction teacher positions funded by the Charter School Categorical Block Grant, Program 13723

During Budget Development a school with an E-CAST enrollment of 143 students in grades 4-5 needed 5 teaching positions to meet the 32.5 non-PHBAO class size. It received 5 district-funded positions using the 35.5 district norm. The school did not need to fund additional class size reduction positions from its Categorical Block Grant Program 13723. On Norm Day, the school's actual enrollment declined to 140 students, and changed the number of district-funded positions to 4 positions; however, the total number of positions required to meet the 32.5:1 remained the same. Therefore, after Norm Day, the school would be required to cover the cost of one teaching position with its Categorical Block Grant, Program 13723.

Scenario 3: A decrease on Norm Day in the number of norm-generated class size reduction teacher positions funded by the Charter School Categorical Block Grant, Program 13723

3A – Growth in norm-generated teacher positions funded by the district and a decrease in TIIG CSR positions: The program code will be changed from 13723 to 10989, 13027, or 11119 as applicable.

During Budget Development, a school with an E-CAST enrollment of 142 students in grades 4-5 needed 5 teaching positions to meet the 32.5 non-PHBAO class size. It received 4 district-funded positions using the 35.5 district norm. The school was required to fund 1 class size reduction position from its Categorical Block Grant Program 13723 to meet the 32.5 class size requirement. On Norm Day, the school's actual enrollment increased to 145 students and the number of district-funded positions also increased to 5 positions; however, the number of positions required to meet the 32.5:1 remained the same. Therefore, after Norm Day, the cost of one teaching position that was previously funded with the school's TIIG Categorical Block Grant will be covered by the district, and the school's Categorical Block Grant will be returned.

3B - A decrease in the number of positions needed to meet the class size requirement due to enrollment decline.

During Budget Development, a school with an E-CAST enrollment of 134 students in grades 4-5 needed 5 teaching positions to meet the 32.5 non-PHBAO class size. It received 4 district funded positions using the 35.5 district norm. The school was required to fund 1 class size reduction position from its Categorical Block Grant Program 13723 to meet the 32.5 class size requirement. On Norm Day, the school's actual enrollment decreased to 119 students. Therefore, the number of positions required to meet the 32.5 class size to positions reduced to 4 positions, and the number of district-funded positions based on the district norm of 35.5 remained the same. After Norm Day, the one teaching position that was previously funded with the school's TIIG Categorical Block Grant is no longer needed.
