Many members of the business community
encourage funding the space colony because they feel it
will lead to the creation of new business opportunities.
They see new investment opportunities in space travel,

Mining these resources could provide new sources for energy production, building materials, and unique products. Getting to and from the space colony will create many opportunities for companies involved in transportation. All of these activities will result in a boost to our entire *economy*.

Some members of the business community are concerned about government funding of a space colony. They feel that this proposal is unfair because it uses *public* funds to favor one business over another. Others have stated that funding a space colony is better left to private businesses. They feel that the *government* is too large with too many offices and people to effectively guide this important mission.
