BOARD REPORT

Action Proposed:

Staff proposes that the Board of Education amend the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to update the Photovoltaic (PV) program and take the following associated actions:

- 1. Cancel two PV installation locations that have been determined to be no longer feasible and/or cost effective:
 - Franklin Primary Center
 - Business Services Division

Approximately \$10.3 Million of PV Program funds was previously approved for installations at these sites and will be made available for other installation locations included in this action. These installations were anticipated to generate approximately 1.64 megawatts (MW) of PV energy.

- 2. Define and approve seven new PV installation locations with a combined budget of \$10.3 Million:
 - Jordan High School
 - Sun Valley Middle School
 - Bannekar Elementary School
 - Curtis Middle School
 - Elizabeth Learning Center
 - Griffith Joyner Elementary School
 - Balboa Magnet School

Once complete, these installations are anticipated to generate 1.64 MW of PV energy.

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Background:

One of the guiding principles of the District's current Bond Program is to provide green, sustainable neighborhood schools for its students and the community at large. This has largely been achieved by incorporating sustainable concepts that help promote a healthy learning environment that is energy and water efficient and minimizes maintenance demands into the design of school construction projects

Currently there are 13 installations in operation throughout the District generating 5.1 MW of PV energy that are anticipated to avoid at least \$708,440 in General Fund costs over the next year:

- Ann Street Elementary School
- Banning High School
- Canoga Park High School
- Cleveland High School
- Edward R. Roybal Learning Center
- El Dorado Elementary School
- Gage Middle School
- Local District 5
- Narbonne Senior High School
- Pico Rivera Warehouse
- South Gate High School
- Southeast Middle School
- White Middle School

In addition, there are nine PV system installations in construction, 29 pending construction start, and five pending award of the design/construction contract.

Expected Outcomes:

Should the Board approve the proposed actions; the PV Program will be updated with the cancellation of two previously approved installation locations and the addition of seven new installation locations.

Overall there will be 63 total installation locations in the District's PV Program, including the Newman Nutrition Center that was delayed as a result of the December 13, 2011 Board amended and adopted prioritization and funding strategy for school IT network infrastructure upgrades (Board Report #086-11/12). In total, the installations are anticipated to generate approximately 20.9 MW of PV energy and avoid at least \$112 Million in General Fund costs over a 20-year period.

Board Options and Consequences:

Failure or delay of approval will postpone the execution and implementation of the proposed installations and the associated General

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Fund benefits from the cost avoidance to the utility budget.

Policy Implications:

The installation of PV systems will help move the District closer to achieving its goals of reducing its energy consumption and promoting a healthier environment.

Budget Impact:

These proposed actions will not impact the overall PV Program budget of \$143,326,366. The funding sources include:

- \$13,734,062 in LADWP settlement funds
- \$31,592,304 in estimated incentive funds
- \$98,000,000 in local Bond funds

The PV Program, once completed as currently defined, is estimated to generate approximately 20.9 MW of PV energy and avoid at least \$112 Million in General Fund costs over a 20-year period. However, the .473 MW of PV energy anticipated to be generated at the Newman Nutrition Center, the associated General Fund cost avoidance and rebates of \$821,399, will be delayed until funding is restored. On December 13, 2011, the Board amended and adopted a prioritization and funding strategy for school IT network infrastructure upgrades. This item delayed \$99 Million from Board-Prioritized Facilities Programs to fund IT upgrade projects at 138 schools. The funding strategy included \$2 Million associated with the installation of PV at the Newman Nutrition Center (Board Report #086-11/12).

Bond Oversight Committee Recommendation: This item was considered by the School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee (BOC) at its meeting of March 21, 2012. The BOC adopted the attached resolution by a vote of "9" ayes and "0" nays.

Staff has concluded that this proposed SEP amendment will help facilitate implementation of the SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the SEP.

Issues and Analysis:

Since June 2008, the Board has approved five separate actions related to the installation of PV systems including a number of changes to the PV Program as a result of:

- Unexpected changes in the direction of the current Bond Program including:
 - o Initiation of Districtwide assessment and planning effort
 - Desire to minimize the use of Certificates of Participation (COPs) as a result of the District's budget crisis
 - o Reallocation of Bond Program funds

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- Unforeseen conditions at school and project sites including:
 - Definition of new projects including campus-wide redevelopment projects
 - o De-funding of projects
 - Development of conceptual campus master plans to redevelop school sites
 - Installation of PV system included in the scope of a larger Board-approved project
- Enhanced Division of the State Architect (DSA) requirements for PV installations on rooftops including:
 - o Increased number of required roof penetrations
 - o Increased number of required roof attachments
- Completion of PV installations including:
 - Actual and anticipated cost of installation and/or PV system size differ

AMENDMENT TO THE FACILITIES SERVICE DIVISION STRATEGIC EXECUTION PLAN TO UPDATE THE PHOTOVOLTAIC PROGRAM

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2011, respectively the Board of Education approved Photovoltaic (PV) Program (Board Report No. 086-11/12) to install 21.4 MW at 59 sites with a budget of \$144,147,765, for an anticipated cost avoidance of \$146,000,000 in General Funds over 20-year period.
