BOARD REPORT

Action Proposed:

Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to allocate \$4.4 Million for the Removal and Replacement of Fold-Up Tables/Benches Program (Program) at 111 schools (see Attachment A). Of the \$4.4 Million Program costs, \$473,985 will be used to reimburse the Maintenance and Operations Branch (M&O) General Fund account for the removal and replacements previously completed at 16 schools. This Program will be funded by the Bond Program Reserve.

Background:

Fold-up tables/benches are installed in many schools throughout the District. This type of furniture is typically located in a school's auditorium, cafeteria or multi-purpose room and is designed to be stored in wall pockets to enable multiple uses and flexibility of the space.

The results of a recently conducted FSD survey indicated that fold-up tables/benches at 111 schools were deteriorated, damaged, posed a potential safety hazard and as such required replacement. Since February 2011, FSD has removed and replaced \$473,985 worth of fold-up tables/benches at 16 school sites with M&O General Funds. In an abundance of caution to ensure student safety, adjustments to the use of fold-up tables/benches at the remaining school sites have been made. All of the tables/benches identified for repair/replacement either can no longer be accessed directly by school site staff or have been secured with special tools.

Expected Outcomes:

Board approval to allocate \$4.4 Million from FSD Bond Program Reserve for the Removal and Replacement of Fold-Up Tables/Benches Program at



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the 111 schools shown in Attachment A. If approved, projects will be developed to procure and install new fold-up tables/benches. This program is scheduled for completion during the second quarter 2013.

Board Options and Consequences:

Should the Board approve this proposed action, staff will proceed with developing projects that will remove and replace the deteriorated fold-up tables/benches in cafeterias and multi-purpose rooms at school sites throughout the District. If the Board does not approve the proposed action, deteriorated and damaged fold-up tables will remain at school sites and accessibility may be limited or eliminated in some cases due to potential safety concerns.

Policy Implications:

These actions are consistent with the District's commitment to address unmet school facilities needs and provide students with a safe and healthy learning environment.

Budget Impact:

If this item is approved, \$4.4 Million from the FSD Bond Program Reserve will be allocated for the removal and replacement of fold-up tables/benches at cafeterias and multi-purpose rooms throughout the District. Of \$4.4 Million budget, \$145,000 will be set aside for contingency to address unforeseen conditions, unanticipated scope changes and cost escalation.

Issues and Analysis:

The compact design of fold-up tables/benches provides schools with needed seating and a flexible school facility. Unlike most furniture used at school sites, fold-up tables/benches are stored in a wall pocket and are folded out for temporary use as needed. The frequent use and subsequent wear and tear of this furniture necessitates a regular condition assessment to identify potential safety issues and required replacements.

Bond Oversight Committee Recommendations: This item was considered by the School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee (BOC) at its meeting of September 21, 2011. The BOC adopted the attached resolution by a vote of X ayes and X noes.

Staff has concluded that this proposed SEP amendment will facilitate implementation of the SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the SEP.
