BOARD REPORT

Action Proposed: Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the

Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve safety related facilities upgrades at ten Early Education Centers (EEC), as listed in Attachment A. These facilities upgrades will provide the ten EECs with a standard secure entry including

upgraded exterior gates and monitored entry control system. The

cumulative budget for these upgrades is \$130,000.

Background: The Early Childhood Education Division (ECED) is committed to

providing a quality early education experience that will prepare students for success in school and life, while valuing and respecting the needs, languages and cultures of all students, families, staff, and the respective communities. To help further this commitment and support the District's goal of closing the achievement gap, approximately \$230,000,000 of current Bond Program funds have been earmarked specifically for ECE projects that provide additional capacity or improve the conditions of

existing centers.

Prior to developing the proposed safety related facilities upgrades included in this Board Report, staff from ECED and FSD assessed all District EECs to identify any unaddressed safety related facilities conditions. The results indicated that ten centers were in need of safety

related facilities improvements.

Expected Outcomes: Board approval of the proposed safety related facilities upgrades at ten

EECs, and the subsequent elimination of the facilities conditions requiring

safety upgrades.



Board Options and Consequences:

Approval of the proposed action will enable staff to undertake facilities upgrades at ten EECs to improve safety conditions. These proposed upgrades will address unmet school facilities needs and provide the District's youngest students with a safe and healthy learning environment.

If the proposed action is not approved, facilities conditions requiring safety related improvements will remain unaddressed at the ten identified EECs.

Policy Implications: This action is consistent with the District's commitment to improve the

conditions of existing ECE facilities as outlined in Measures K, R, and Y.

Budget Impact: The proposed projects will be funded by \$130,000 of Bond Program funds

earmarked specifically for ECE facilities projects.

Issues and Analysis: The execution of these facilities upgrades will provide a safe learning

environment for all students, staff and respective community members.

Bond Oversight Committee Recommendation: This item will be considered by the School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee (BOC) at its meeting on March 20, 2013. The BOC adopted the attachment resolution by a vote of 12 ayes and 0 nays.

Staff has concluded that this proposed FSD-SEP amendment will help facilitate implementation of the FSD-SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the FSD-

SEP.

AMENDMENT TO THE FACILITIES SERVICES STRATEGIC EXECUTION PLAN TO DEFINE AND APPROVE SAFETY RELATED FACILITIES UPGRADES AT TEN EARLY EDUCATION CENTERS

WHEREAS, District staff proposes that the Board of Education (Board) approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve safety related facilities upgrades at 10 Early Education Centers (ECE) as described in attached Board Report No. 232-12/13 (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, this action is consistent with the District's commitment to provide additional capacity for early childhood education students, and improve the conditions of existing ECE facilities as outlined in Measures K, R, and Y; and

WHEREAS, projects are developed at the discretion of the Board District or Educational Service Center with support from Facilities Services Division staff and input from school administrators. All projects must be capital in nature and adhere to bond language and laws; and

WHEREAS, the proposed safety related facilities upgrades at 10 Early Education Centers will upgrade, modernize and help improve safety of the learning environment for students. The cumulative budget for these upgrades is \$130,000; and
