Amendment to the Facilities Services Division Strategic Execution Plan to Define and Approve Projects at 107 Schools to Replace Deteriorated Playground Matting Systems and/or Structures

Action Proposed:

Staff proposes that the Board of Education approve an amendment to the Facilities Services Division (FSD) Strategic Execution Plan (SEP) to define and approve 107 projects to replace deteriorated playground matting systems and/or structures with a combined project budget of \$9,693,156 as described in Attachment A.

Background:

Historically, Facilities Maintenance and Operations (M&O) has relied on two primary funding sources to manage exigent school site repairs: Routine Repair General Maintenance (RRGM-General Fund) and Deferred Maintenance (DM-General Fund). However, State budget flexibility provisions have resulted in severe funding reductions to the RRGM and Deferred Maintenance programs. As a result, large unforeseen critical repair needs deemed to be urgent in nature must be addressed with capital funding sources.

Staff recently indentified the need to undertake 107 new critical projects to replace playground matting systems and/or playground structures . The existing playground matting systems are badly damaged or deteriorated beyond economical repair and pose a potential safety hazard. A majority of this matting is poured in place which makes it difficult to replace one section. A new material has been identified for these replacement projects, which lends itself to easier and less costly future repairs. The playground structures being proposed for replacement are significantly damaged and/or were constructed with out-of-date steel pipe and require replacement.

Project budgets may vary based on the existing matting system type (i.e. poured in place or tile) and the size and shape (i.e. square, rectangular and octagon) of the matting system to be remove and replaced. Other influencing factors include: whether the playground equipment needs to be temporarily relocated and replaced during construction and additional requirements for curb removal or installation. Once construction commences, each project is anticipated to be constructed in no more than five weeks. The school sites are located throughout the District.

Expected Outcomes:

Approval of the proposed action, which will enable 107 critically needed projects that will

improve the safety and health of students to be executed.

Board Options and Consequences:

A "yes" vote will authorize construction of 107 critical projects. If the proposed action is not approved, health and safety issues at District elementary schools will remain unaddressed.

Policy Implications:

This action is consistent with the District's commitment to address unmet school facilities needs and provide students with a safe and healthy learning environment.

Budget Impact: (Revised 1/7/14, 1:06 p.m.)

The combined project budget for the 107 Critical Repair projects is \$9,693,156. These projects will be funded by Bond Program funds earmarked in the School Upgrade Program specifically for critical school repair and safety improvements to school building components.

Issues and Analysis:

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), more than 200,000 children ages 0-19 were treated for playground equipment-related injuries in 2010. Playground surfacing is one of the most critical factors in reducing the severity of injuries due to falls.

Bond Oversight Committee Recommendations:

This item was considered by the School Construction Bond Citizens' Oversight Committee (BOC) at its meeting of December 18, 2013. The BOC's adopted resolution, including the vote of the Committee, will be forwarded under separate cover.

Staff has concluded that this proposed SEP amendment will facilitate implementation of the SEP, and therefore, it will not adversely affect the District's ability to successfully complete the SEP.
