Grab and Go Update

Now that students are returning to the classroom, we will be transitioning our food service back to a school-based effort focused on children. Beginning the week of April 12, students who return for in-person instruction will be provided multiple meals at school.

Students who continue with online learning from home can still pick up meals from their own school site or the closest elementary school, including those students in middle school and high school. This will make certain every child can continue to receive meals from their local school.

There will be no drive-throughs. The number of meals will be limited to five unless student identifications are provided.

Adults will no longer be eligible for Grab and Go meals at our schools. Those in need may find food assistance online through the pantry locator at:

Mask Accommodation/Exemption Process: The Division of Special Education has released guidance on a mask accommodation/exemption process. The process should be applied on case by case basis and on a very limited basis. In short, the parents have to obtain medical confirmation from their medical provider that the student cannot wear the mask and reason for not wearing it. Once medical confirmation and reason is provided to the school, a school team meets with the parents to consider accommodations to help the student wear the mask. Related Services Space As part of the LAUSD/UTLA Side letter for Special Education, we are being asked to submit room numbers or space that have been assigned to related services. An appropriate working space is defined as: 1. All itinerant staff shall be provided a clearly defined workspace that adheres to health and safety standards required by the UTLA-LAUSD Sideletter for Reopening. School psychologists shall be provided with space that ensures student confidentiality during crisis and/or counseling. 2. A workspace shall have basic furniture appropriate for physical distancing, including a workstation and adult size chair, functioning internet access and student appropriate desks/chairs. Access to the bathroom and designated room will be provided. A locked storage cabinet will be provided for materials needing to be secured as determined by the department supervisor. Other specialized equipment may be requested from each department. The audiology department will set up the needed hearing aid equipment. Room Assignments may be submitted to the LRE Specialist. Assignments will then be submitted to the DSE who will then be informing the respective departments to provide to providers. 
