The Covid 19 pandemic has led to an increase in anxiety rates in adolescents and children. This anxiety might be heightened as students prepare to return physically to school campuses and have to re-adjust to new routines, worry about getting sick, and separation from their parents/caregivers for the first time in over a year. With that in mind, we want to share simple strategies that educators and other school staff can use to help alleviate students' anxiety about returning to school.	SEL and Hybrid Learning Five Resiliency Factors SHHS and PCS
Validate, support, and listen to students- Listen to students' concerns and even if the emotions are extreme, express understanding and empathy. Letting families know you understand and appreciate their perspective will help open up a dialogue for problem-solving.	
Be honest and encouraging, rather than reassuring: Anxious students will likely need some initial assurance from trusted adults and teachers that returning to campus is okay. Acknowledge risks while emphasizing how precautions reduce those risks and how students can feel good about coming back to school given all of the thought and planning that has gone into protecting students. 
