SCHOOL WAIVERS FOR ALTERNATIVE CONFIGURATIONS Principals, please be aware that schools must complete Attachment A, the LAUSD/UTLA Waiver Request form of MEM-6680.4 for each waiver requested. The waiver approval process as well as the type of waivers available are outlined in the aforementioned Memorandum. Schools must use the Waiver Request form included in MEM-6680.4 – School Waivers for Alternative Configurations; waiver requests received on outdated forms will not be processed	<u>MEM-6680.4</u> <u>School Waiver Request Form</u>
ACCESS AND RESPONSE TO CRITICAL MATERIAL IN PERSONNEL FILE – TEACHERS When the District receives a letter or other written material from a member of the public critical of a teacher's performance or character, the matter shall first be investigated. Except under compelling circumstances, the UTLA represented employee shall be given a copy within thirty (30) days of the District's receipt of the document. The document shall neither be placed in the personnel file nor retained by the District unless it is reasonably determined that the allegations have some substance or plausibility. If the document is either retained or placed in the employee's personnel file, the employee shall be given a reasonable opportunity to attach a reply. If the document came from within District personnel, an investigation may not be necessary or appropriate but all the aforementioned protections, including the notice to the employee shall be applicable (LAUSD/UTLA CBA, Article X, Section 9.0).

Vacation Scheduling and Vacation Cap Classified employees who earn more vacation than can be used during the Winter and Spring Recess should be allowed to schedule vacation during the school year. Principals should notify Classified employees who are expected to exceed their vacation cap at end of year. Your timekeeper and/or approver can access and print a vacation statement to assist with identifying these employees. The vacation statement is available in BTS using the transaction code ZTMRVACBAL.	
Once employees have been identified, supervisors should work with employees to schedule vacation time. Scheduling employees' vacation time now will provide the most flexibility and ensure sufficient staffing of schools and offices throughout the school year. Vacation requests for Classified employees that have insufficient vacation days left to cover the Winter and Spring Recesses should not be approved.	
Isolation/Quarantine Time Reporting	
Employees who are directed by the Community Engagement (CE) Team to isolate or quarantine should be reported as MSND if remote work is not available. When the employee is cleared to return to work, the CE Team Member will provide an email to the employee notifying them they are cleared to report. Employees who are asked to isolate or quarantine by anyone outside of the District, and remote work is not available, will have to avail themselves of their benefit time.

<b>Important Hotspot Update: Zero-Use Hotspots</b> Students need hotspots. We are aware of hundreds of hotspots that have not been used in the last 3 months. These are termed "zero-use" hotspots. Some are in inventory and some are checked out to students who are not using them. We are trying to retrieve these hotspots to redeploy to students in need. If you have not already received a zero-use hotspot report from your operations coordinator, please send an email request for one. The report shows which students are not using their hotspot. Please ask your IDM to reach out to the students to find out why the hot spot has not been in use, and request that they be returned to the school site if not needed. If you don't need recovered hotspots, please contact your operations coordinator and we will coordinate pick up from your school and redeploy to other sites as needed. #### GUIDANCE FOR SITE ADMINISTRATORS AND SUPERVISORS REGARDING ASSEMBLY BILL (AB) 685:

Effective January 1, 2021, AB 685 requires notification to all employees, their labor representatives, and employers of contracted employees at a worksite of potential COVID-19 exposures, related benefits and protections, and disinfection and safety measures that will be taken at the worksite in response to the potential exposure. **Potential Exposure to COVID-19** 

If a site administrator or supervisor receives notice of potential exposure to COVID-19, the employer shall take the following action steps within one (1) business day of the notice of potential exposure. The COVID-19 Mandatory Compliance Alert (Attached), "Notification Checklist for Positive COVID-19 Cases" assists administrators to meet the requirements with California Labor Law.

•	Add the MAGICAL word. Oftentimes, students use the word, CAN'T, in their self-declarations. "I CAN'T read." "I CAN'T do this hard math problem." Teach students to add the word, YET, to their self-declarations! Teach them to say, "I can't read words in this text, YET!" "I can't make three pointers, YET!" "I haven't earned an 'A' in this class, YET!" One word can drastically change a student's perspective and mindset!

<ul> <li>Hispanics were more likely to suffer from Bulimia than Non-Hispanics. Also a trend towards a higher prevalence of binge eating in all minority groups.</li> <li>Black teenagers are 50% more likely to exhibit Bulimic behavior than White teenagers, such as binging and purging.</li> <li>Eating disorders affect a higher proportion of males who identify as gay or bisexual than female, the majority of males with eating disorders are heterosexual.</li> </ul>


