Reminder on Behalf of OGC: Schools Files Project	https://schoolfiling.lausd.net
The LAUSD School Files application is the LAUSD application designed for Principals and Administrators to upload inappropriate behavior-related documents on a regular basis into the School Files system. This webbased application only requires a few entries to add documents. Please note that all user logins are recorded. Users are to upload documents as PDF files. Log in to the application using your SSO account. For specific instructions on completing this process, please contact your Staff Relations Field Director.	
Extended Leaves of Absence (Workers' Compensation or Illness)	
It is the responsibility of the school site administrator to follow up on all leaves. For Workers' Compensation coverage, you should be in contact with the Claims Adjuster at Sedgwick to stay apprised of the employee's status and return date. If you need additional assistance with an employee, a current claim, or return to work procedures, contact the Integrated Disability Management office at (213) 241-3138. For employees absent due to illness for longer than twenty (20) days, formal Leave of Absence forms and other documentation must be submitted. Employees who have not submitted required doctor-approved leave documentation should be time-reported as unpaid after their 20th consecutive workday absence. However, should the required doctor-approved leave documentation be submitted late, payroll adjustments from unpaid should be strongly considered (Article XII, Section 12.9).

New APEIS Allocation: We also have some very exciting news for all elementary sites. Next year, all elementaries will have a full time or half time APEIS assigned. Just this week, the Board of Education approved 110 additional APEISs, and 20 of those will be allocated to LD Central. A second vote to approve another 110 will be held in July, potentially adding 25 more positions to LD Central. We are currently flying multiple APEIS positions for LD Central. Please share the flyer with any potential candidates. As APEIS assignments are being developed, APEIS will be providing temporary coverage to the uncovered schools until all positions are filled. There will also be full and half time Bridge coordinator positions coming soon for secondary sites. We have gone through a year of uncertainty. As we prepare to close out the school year, remember to practice "Self-Care" over the summer. Take time to select and practice those appropriate and will sustain your Mental Health.

- 1. Be mindful of you, who you are and where you are. Most falls take place because the person is not mindful of their location.
- 2. Practice JOY! Write 24 things that brings you joy. If it's not on the list, don't do it!
- 3. Wellness starts in your mind! Think positive.
- 4. Identify "what's" filling my bucket and what's draining my bucket."
- 5. Practice the power of 10. Start the day with 10-minutes of devotion, 10 minutes of Bible, 10 minutes of meditation!
- Rest when necessary, even if it's before normal bedtime. Take a 10-minute power nap.
- 7. Take an immediate exit from conversations containing culturally offensive language or practice. Do not linger.
- 8. Drink water; eat lots of fruits and vegetables; exercise (walking is great).
- 9. Share your joy! With your students, friends, family, or in a journal.
- 10. Practice Social and Emotional Learning Core Competencies with students.
- 11. Create a goal to change a toxic environment to a loving and caring one.
- 12. If above is not possible, remove yourself from the toxic environment. Set the temperature for Joy!
- 13. Do not carry any negativity more than 24 hours, then say something or do something to remove it from your spirit!
- 14. There is power in the word "NO." Do not overextend yourself!
- 15. Keep the main thing, the main thing!
- 16. Always return to the things that brings you JOY!

May was Mental Health Month. This year, the challenge is to change the way you refer to Mental Disease, from Mental Illness to Mental Wellness or Mental Health.

CHECK YOUR BIASES

As with any kind of advocacy, it's crucial to understand our background and possible biases about LGBTQ people. We might have inadvertently internalized negative messages about LGBTQ folks so it is important to delve into these beliefs, challenge and ultimately address these misconceptions authentically.

TEACH INCLUSIVELY

The things we teach and how we teach them can send important messages to our students about whether or not they are valued as they are. Include a variety of gender representations.

When students are presented with a narrow picture of gender roles—and they don't see themselves in any of them—they develop a sense early on that something is wrong with them.

BE VISIBLE

Let your LGBTQ students know that you are an ally by displaying some visible sign of your support. Hanging a rainbow flag or a in your classroom can accomplish this. GLSEN's *Safe Space Kit* points out that this kind of visibility affects students more than we might even realize. "Even if students don't come to you directly, the kit says, "research shows that just knowing that there is a supportive educator at school can help LGBTQ students feel better about being in school."




