Schools who have preferred substitutes who are available may prearrange them into the position. Once the job is created in smartfind, the system and the substitute unit will work on finding someone.

Vacation Cap

An <u>overlapping/concurrent enrollment</u> occurs when a student that is enrolled in two districts and the state system is displaying them as enrolled in another district within the state of California during the same period of time.

When not corrected, these concurrent enrollments may adversely affect a school's dropout data.

It is important for schools to review the certify rule CCE-100-0010-Concurrent Enrollment Abnormalities Report on their Data Certifications Scorecard and make corrections as appropriate.


Beating the Odds: Overcoming Homelessness During the Pandemic

This week we feature a family from Weemes ES who was able to overcome the insurmountable challenge of experiencing homelessness. The story begins in May 2020 when the SSS Counselor Carina Vasquez received an email from one of the student's teachers informing her that the father and the boys were sleeping in their car. The student's mother left the father and the three boys for unknown reasons. The father struggled finding child care and working long hours. The school had been trying to contact the family due to the lack of connectivity. They did not have any belongings and the students could not attend school because they did not have access to technology. SSSC provided information on a community housing agency, HOPICS, with walk-in services including required documents, address contact information and hours of operation. Father went to HOPICS the next morning and the family was linked to services. They received emergency hotel vouchers.

During this time SSSC also made a referral to the Homeless Education Office who provided bags of clothing and toys. With the help of school staff the family also were given a hotspot and device.

At the beginning of this school year the family was still living in a hotel. The parents were unable to be reached and the students were not attending online. SSSC then mailed out Student Engagement Letters to the last address provided. The parent returned the call and a Student Engagement Team Meeting was held where the support staff were introduced including the SSSC, PSW, School Psychologist and Assistant Principal. Step-mother went to school to get help with log in information. SSSC referred to the Student Supervision Program. After the meeting, improvement was seen in students' attendance and participation. Step-mother communicated with the SSSC more often and asked for help when needed.

During Christmas season, SSSC referred the family to Sponsor a Family where they received gift cards and food donations.

In January, the family finally found a temporary home. SSSC ensured parent knew the students' right to remain at their school of origin. Before school reopening they attended their nearest Student Supervision Program to ensure they had access to internet and received help logging in to their classes. Upon the return to school SSSC assisted them with return to school procedures including filling out Return to School Preference forms, COVID testing appointment as well as generating a daily pass. The school welcomed the brothers with new backpacks on their first day back to school. The students are now on campus daily with their smiling faces every day! A big thank you to our SSS Counselor and the collaborating school staff, Homeless Education Office HOPICS and the many other staff who helped to support this family in overcoming obstacles even during the pandemic.


