2021 Graduation Caps, Tassels and Gowns

Please refer to Reference Guide 6484.7 which outlines policies and procedures for schools to order District provided “rental” graduation caps, tassels and gowns. It also lists procedures for students to purchase caps, tassels, and gowns as “keepsakes.” Schools cannot require students to purchase or rent a cap, tassel, and gown as a condition for participation in the graduation ceremony.

COVID-19 School Compliance Task Force Team Reminder:

The purpose of the School Compliance Task Force is to monitor and review safety protocols at your school. Therefore, the Compliance Task Force Team should be meeting weekly to address issues and determine solutions as a school site team. Please refer to the COVID-19 Containment Response and Control Plan for detailed information about the roles and responsibilities of the School Compliance Task Force Team. Also attached is the Screening and Exposure Decision Pathways presentation to help your team.

Year-End Coding for All 12th Grade Students

This Reference Guide provides the due date and instructions for the required data entry of year-end coding for 12th graders. This data is used to determine the preliminary four-year cohort graduation rate for every comprehensive high school. Schools must finish entering the 2020-21 year-end flag (YEF) and leave reason entry codes in MiSiS for all 12th grade students. The data is submitted to the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data Systems (CALPADS) and will be used in the calculation of Cohort Graduation Rates for the California School Dashboard. Final corrections and/or changes must be done in MiSiS no later than **August 25, 2021**.

Computing Device Refresh Program:

Each year, the IT Asset Management Team evaluates the need to refresh each school's inventory of viable computing devices (i.e., Chromebooks, iPads, laptops) to ensure every student is ready to participate successfully in online/hybrid instruction. “When a Final Evaluation Report is marked ‘Below Standard,’ the evaluator shall specifically describe in writing the area(s) of below standard performance, together with recommendations for improvement, and the assistance given and to be given.” (Article X, Section 6.0). The written description is known as the BSE Attachment. Your Staff Relations Field Director will provide you with a template. The completed document is given to the employee during the meeting and also attached to the evaluation and uploaded to the MyPGS platform. If you plan to issue a BSE, notify the person in writing at least five days prior to the scheduled meeting and inform them of their right to have representation at the meeting.

During the Month of May, we celebrate the influence and contributions of Asian Americans and Pacific Islander Americans to the history, culture and achievements of the United States of America. Many Americans are familiar with the numerous historical records that have documented the experiences of Asian Americans and Pacific Islander Americans during the Gold Rush era, beginning in the 1800s. However, few people are aware of the first documented presence of Filipinos in California in the late 1500s and the first permanent settlement of Filipino Americans in the 1700s along the bayous of Louisiana. Furthermore, it is important to reflect on the diverse representation of Asian Americans and Pacific Islander Americans with cultural roots in more than 20 countries in Asia. Although more than 21 million Americans today can trace their ancestry to various Asian countries, including the Pacific Islands, many of their stories remain untold.

In recognition for Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month and Mental Health Awareness, we want to focus on the importance of the mental health and wellbeing of the AAPI community. The AAPI communities have several factors that support mental health and wellbeing, such as strong family connections and cultural practices that promote a mind, body, and spirit balance.

However, people from Asian and Pacific Islander communities may be less likely to seek mental health support than the general population. In some Asian cultures, expression of one's feelings is an admission of weakness.

Furthermore, the words used in some languages to describe mental health challenges have negative connotations which contribute to strong stigma around mental illness. Discussing mental health needs and accessing help for emotional concerns can be difficult in the AAPI population.

<p>Mental Health Awareness & AAPI Heritage Month cont'd:</p> <p>Mental health can be viewed negatively, and talking openly about anything emotional (i.e. sadness, disappointments, various life events, etc.) is rarely encouraged. Suicide is the leading cause of death among Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders aged 20-24 years old. Asian Americans are three times less likely to seek treatment than other racial groups in the U.S. The latest wave of hate crimes targeting AAPI community members has taken a severe mental toll.</p> <p>These alarming statistics show the need for AAPI community members to know where they can access help, and the importance of encouraging them to get support for mental health issues that arise such as depression and anxiety. Awareness needs to be raised regarding reducing stigma and increasing culturally sensitive interventions. The Asian Pacific Counseling and Treatment Centers, is offering free mental health services — including counseling and therapy — for victims of hate attacks during the pandemic, with no health insurance requirement.</p>



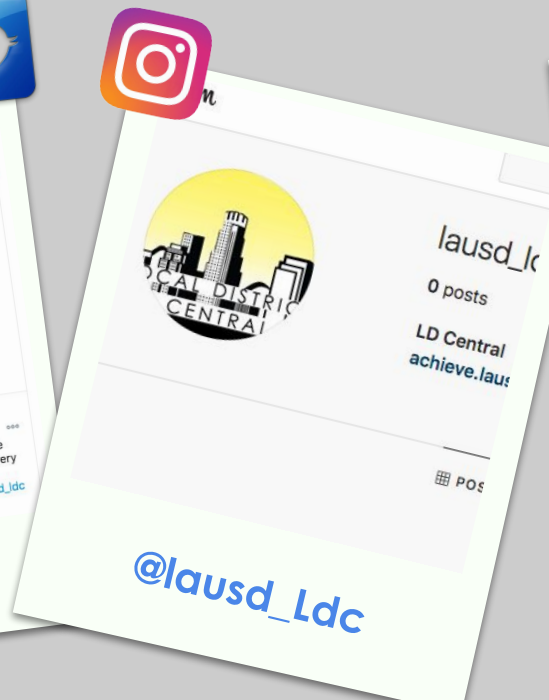
