Verizon Hotspot Recall

The Verizon corporation is recalling over 2 million Ellipsis Jetpack mobile hotspot devices due to a risk that the lithium-ion battery in the devices could overheat, posing a potential burn or fire hazard.

As the safety of our students and staff at Los Angeles Unified is paramount, we take this recall very seriously and have been working in close partnership with Verizon to develop a process to change out recalled devices for new ones in the safest and most efficient way possible.

Verizon is currently making arrangements to provide replacement devices and deliver directly to every school. They have informed us that deliveries are scheduled to take place May 24 through June 4. The number of devices to be delivered to each school will correspond to the number showing as currently active at each school plus a 25% buffer. If you have immediate questions or have families who are asking to exchange a hotspot immediately, please contact our IT Asset Management team for assistance. 

This week we will feature an event from last Friday, May 21 provided by our A-G Counselor Cheryl Samson Ramirez at Frida Kahlo Continuation School. Congratulations to the team for providing this inclusive, engaging best practice.

Frida Kahlo Continuation High School, apart of the Jefferson/South Central Community of Schools, has a current enrollment of 140 students, 73% of which are Tier 3 students who are missing 5 or more A-G requirements needed for graduation and 86% of whom are chronic absentees. It has been an extremely difficult year for our students and families who faced a myriad of challenges ranging from: unemployment, lack of transportation, lack of access to quality health care, lack of stable housing, lack of stable internet connectivity, an increase of our student population that has needed to also contribute financially to their households or assist with childcare/household responsibilities while living in multi-generational households. The barriers can be daunting, which makes the need for instilling hope and inspiration much more of a priority.

"Choose Your Own Adventure", Frida Kahlo Continuation High School's FIRST Virtual Career/Resource/College fair was birthed from these circumstances, coupled with a vision to instill more for a community that deserves more. When you raise the bar for students, you give them a higher self expectation. 36 students participated in our virtual fair on Friday, May 21, 2021. 9 career fair speakers, who provided recorded interviews and represented the following companies/agencies: Apple TV, the City of Whittier Police Department, LA County Emergency Response Team, Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority, The School of Arts and Enterprise, Arts for a Better Tomorrow, Easton Garden Designs, Half Morton Shoe Designs, and Diaz Law Firm. 3 resource fair speakers presented, including our LAUSD Youth Source Center with Coalition for Responsible Community Development, All Peoples Community and Family Source Center, and Pacific Clinics, our incoming mental health provider. Lastly, our college fair included 3 local community colleges (LACC, LASW, and GCC), 2 trade schools (LA Trade Tech & Art Center College of Design), and 5 Cal State Universities, UCs, and Private Universities (CSUDH, CSULB, UCSB, UCLA, and Mount St. Mary's University). The gems that our speakers left for students, including personal advice on how to pursue a specific career route or school, was all very valuable. We hope that our students could take the knowledge that they learned as tools to help them "Choose Their Own Adventure" as they start to envision their lives post-graduation.




