Dear Principals: The end of the year is around the corner and there is still much to be done. Schools are working hard to schedule and hold IEPs for students by the end of the year. In addition to holding IEPs, there almost 1000 IEPs comin up before the end of the year. Currently we have about 735 overdue IEPs and about 114 are initial IEPs. Here are some facts that underscore the urgency to dispel stigma and other barriers accessing mental health: Mental health conditions are common among teens and young adults. 50% of all lifetime mental illnesses develop by age 14 and 75% develop by age 24. 1 in 6 U.S. youth experience a mental health condition each year, but only half get treatment. When not corrected, these concurrent enrollments may adversely affect a school's dropout data.

It is important for schools to review the certify rule CCE-100-0010-Concurrent Enrollment Abnormalities Report on their Data Certifications Scorecard and make corrections as appropriate.


