Attendance and the Holidays

As the winter break approaches, it will be crucial for school leaders to closely monitor students out for extended periods of time. Around the holidays we tend to see an influx of students missing school several weeks before and after the winter break. Our goal is to ensure that every student is enrolled, attending, and on track to graduate. Schools should exercise due diligence prior to withdrawing a student from school/MISIS. Withdrawing a student from school/MISIS without knowing where the student will be attending may result in the student showing up on the **Certify potential drop out/drop out report.**



Schools should ensure that all efforts are made prior to withdrawing a student from school as whereabouts. Schools should also document all methods of contact in MISIS.

Identify Students:

Run the Master Absence Report and select 10 days of consecutive absence. Review report and proceed with the following steps:

- Contact all numbers listed in MISIS in effort to reach the family to determine student's whereabouts
- Review cumulative file for other leads (address listed, phone numbers, etc.)
- Mail home the not attending/not enrolled letter. Be sure to indicate on the envelope that postal services DO NOT forward the letter elsewhere.
- Conduct a home visit

Home visits provide school staff with a deeper understanding of a pupil's blueprint and underlying needs. This allows staff to assess, reflect, and link pupils to appropriate support services. If you are aware that the student is at home and refusing to attend school, do not withdraw the student. Consult with your school team to determine next steps (subsequent home visit with other school staff, SART meeting, exploring alternative educational options, mental health resources, etc.).

Holiday Absences

Student and staff absences increase before and after holiday breaks. In order to reduce the number of absences during this time, remind staff and families of the importance of being at school each and every day. A few ways to promote attendance during the holiday season include:

- * Coordinate activities on the days of expected high absences
- * Send letters home reminding families of the days students are expected to return from school holidays
- Promote an attendance incentive for all students who are present every day for a set period of time, i.e., winter break

In addition, it is recommended that school leaders take a proactive approach to communicating expectations around employee attendance by sending an email, memo, or other reminder.

2019-2020 Winter Recess and District Shutdown Days

LD Central staff would like to offer school leaders guidance with scheduling the custodial staff during the winter recess (see <u>MEM-061107.1</u>).

December 25, 31, 2019 and January 1, 2020 are legal paid holidays for employees.

District shutdown days are December 26, 27 and 30, 2019 (three days). Employees can use vacation time if:

1. They have enough vacation time

2. The site administrator approves vacation (employees must use vacation time on shutdown days)

December 23 & 24, 2019 and **January 2, 3, 6, 7, 8, 9, & 10, 2020** are working days for "A" basis employees. Custodial staff may request vacation time for these days. Should your custodial staff work on these **9 days**, it is recommended that school leaders meet with their plant manager and create a job list (deep clean restrooms, sweep and mop all classrooms, work on any special projects, etc.) to complete during those days.

Restorative Justice Strategies and Practices—Beyond Circles

A community-building circle is the most recognizable strategy within the Restorative Justice menu of activities available to enhance school culture and climate. If you are still waiting to implement circles, or you have already started but want some ideas to supercharge your practice, consider these:

<u>Circle Themes/Topics</u>: Keep circles fresh and relevant by leveraging your school's character goals (e.g., Safety, Responsibility, Respect), or using recurring character days such as National Kindness Day, National Character Day, Valentine's Day, Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday....one source for National Days is: <u>https://nationaltoday.com/national-day-calendar/</u>, with a list of popular and obscure birthdays, holidays and national days that appeal both to teacher and students. Also, local community or national



events can be appropriate topics for circle discussion, depending on your experience and students' age.

- <u>Academic Circles:</u> Teachers can integrate their current study unit into a circle to review what is known, or still needs review. Use as a forum for students to express feedback about a story or recent study unit.
- Prompts Box: Set up a box for students to submit prompts for upcoming circles. Some guidelines could include: one funny/one serious; themed (see first bullet, above); anonymous or credited. This is an easy way to build student engagement and anticipation. Make sure to carefully read the prompts before you use!
- <u>Check-Ins/Check-Outs:</u> Once students are familiar with core guidelines, implement brief circles regularly (such as a check-in on Monday and a check-out on Friday). This is the perfect compromise to reinforce community-building without taking a lot of time.

Employee Safety Seal Program

Every year, the Worker's Compensation claims for employee injuries cost the District over \$100 million. These claims not only represent a financial loss for the District, they also represent a loss of the health and well-being of staff.

The goal of LAUSD's Employee Safety Seal Program is to help reduce employee injuries while celebrating the schools' commitment to safety.

Schools earn a "Safety Seal" by taking steps to ensure Staff work safely and are free from hazards.

Benefits of participation in the program:

- Certificate of recognition based on level of employee safety achieved.
- Safety Seal graphic that can be posted on the school's website.
- Rating level displayed on the school's annual school accountability report card.

Most importantly, your students will be learning, and your staff will be working in a safer school environment!
