#### **Outgoing Mail Procedures**

As a reminder, the mail unit is not distributing or picking up any mail. However, if you have any outgoing mail, you may drop off your mail at Lanterman HS, 2328 St. James Place, 90007. Please enter on the back side of campus next to the Mt. Saint Mary's kiosk. Park on the track. Next to the flagpole is a cart with empty boxes for you to drop off your outgoing mail. Mail will be taken at 11:30 am each day to the Beaudry Mail Unit. Any mail dropped off after 11:30 am will be taken to the Beaudry mail unit the following day.

It is very important that you prepare the outgoing mail properly, or the Mail Unit will not send. All envelopes must be completely sealed. If the envelope has a metal clasp, the clasp must be covered with packing tape. Every package needs both a send to address and return address. Mail Unit will not send mail without a return address. Also, do not use LAUSD interoffice mail envelopes (the ones with the holes in it) for US Mail. They will not accept it. Please refer to the <u>Mail Unit User Guide</u> before sending outgoing mail so that you can be sure it gets sent.

#### **On-line Bell Schedule**

The 2020-21 Online Bell Schedule system is now available to schools. Schools may access the system by typing **principalportal.lausd.net** or **bellschedule.lausd.net** in the URL. Currently, the system defaults to school year 2019-20. Schools can change the school year by clicking on the down arrow in the school year field and selecting 2020-21. I have already requested ITD to change the default school year to 2020-21. If schools need assistance on the bell schedule, they can email Betty <u>betty.chong@lausd.net</u> or <u>aileen.santos@lausd.net</u>.

The Bell Schedule and Waiver timeline remains the same. Please hold a meeting via Zoom to obtain the vote of the three groups that need to sign off on the waiver as you have been doing for SSC and BAC. We also suggest that you use an anonymous ballot procedure just as you would when you hold a vote for the teachers. The district references having a 72 -hour notice for these meetings, advertising them the way you normally would advertise for a meeting

#### **PSW Work Highlights**

We currently have 64 Psychiatric Social Workers (PSWs) across LD Central. They are adapting to remote working and have been supporting their school communities in a variety of creative virtual ways. This week I want to highlight Newsletters that Hooper Ave PSW Tina Ying and Ramon A. Cortines VAPA PSW, Laura Travnitz have been creating on a weekly basis with the help of their Master of Social Work interns. Ms. Ying also collaborates with Hooper School Psychologist and School Nurse in contributing wellness articles. Another reason I wanted to highlight their newsletters is because they cover strategies and positive coping skills that will help all of us, students, parents, teachers, administrators get through this global crisis. I think we can all will benefit from their newsletters this week. Ms. Ying posts her Hooper Wellness Newsletter in her Google Classroom and Ms. Travnitz shares it on the Roman A. Cortines VAPA Schoology page. Please click on title to read full versions of their newsletters. They are both quick and easy to reads. Cortines VAPA even has recipes and encourages to be mindful when we are eating.

#### Excerpt from Cortines VAPA Mindfulness Newsletter:

**Why Mindfulness?** We talk about mindfulness a lot at VAPA and there is good reason for that! Scientific studies have shown that practicing guided meditation and other relaxation exercises regularly can truly result in positive changes in our lives. Here are just some of the reasons we think mindfulness is the bomb:

- Mindfulness actually rewires your brain to help you learn and remember things
- Mindfulness triggers the brain to produce new cells which helps to fight stress
- Mindfulness improves our ability to focus and make decisions
- Mindfulness boosts creativity and problem solving
- Mindfulness helps build compassion

#### **Balloon Breaths**

There are 2 types of breathing: *chest breathing* and *belly breathing*. *Chest breathing* is taking shallow breaths and not a whole lot of air gets into our lungs. This can make our bodies tense when we are under stress and can increase feelings of anxiety. When we use *belly breathing*, or **balloon breaths**, we use our diaphragm (a muscle between our chest and abdomen), which allows us to take much deeper breaths and help us to feel calmer, more relaxed and less stressed. So let's practice taking some balloon breaths:

- 1. Think of your belly as a **balloon**.
- 2. Put your hand on your belly to feel it rise and fall.
- 3. Take a deep breath in through your nose to fill your balloon.
- 4. Hold your breath for 2 seconds.
- 5. Breath out through your mouth, as if you are deflating the balloon.
- 6. Repeat this breathing at least 5 times.

#### **iFoster Partners with LAUSD to serve Foster Youth**

iFoster is a national non-profit with over 40,000 members across all 50 states and an estimated 500 new members join iFoster every month. iFoster's mission is to ensure that every child growing up outside of their biological home has the resources and opportunities they need to become successful, independent adults.

Over 40,000 foster youth in California can no longer attend school, visit with their social workers, therapists and extended family. iFoster has identified that the #1 need reported by foster youth during the COVID-19 crisis is the inability to communicate due to a lack of technology. Over 5,000 devices have been delivered to California's foster youth over the past three weeks. So, we are excited that iFoster and LAUSD are partnering to address the need of the over 800 foster youth in LAUSD that do not have access to technology. Within LD Central, 62 foster youth are in need of either laptops or hot spots. Student Support Programs is providing iFoster with the information on the foster youth across the district who still need devices, with a priority on serving high school students. It is our hope that this need will be met in the next month. Thank you to iFoster

#### **Technology Distribution Updates**

#### **Principal's Portal Updates**

Thank you all for your efforts to update your "Device Distribution Progress" within the <u>Principal's Portal</u>. As a reminder, principals may continue to update their responses as progress is made in distributing devices into the hands of students. The information gathered by your responses has been critical as this allows our local district superintendents, directors, and team members to access real time data on your schools' progress and needs. Please review the following list of "housekeeping" items:

- Please include your distribution schedule.
- Continue to update your device distribution quantities so we may know how many students have received a district device.
- If you have already received your device delivery from the District please update your need to "0". Should your device need increase you may update the quantity, however, please e-mail us so that we can inform the project team of the change.
- Please use the IT Asset Management system for the <u>checkout of devices to students</u>. If you are unable to access
  the system you may request access for Instructional Device Manager (IDM) by following the process outlined in
  the following <u>link</u>. Should your school be unable to use the IT Asset Management system please keep track of
  device distribution on a spreadsheet and include student name, student ID, and device serial number/LAUSD
  asset tag information. It is imperative that you keep track of your assets.

#### **Hot Spot Requests**

Schools may continue requesting hotspots for students without home internet. If your students need a hotspot please submit a <u>Request for Wi-Fi Hotspots</u> online. To help ensure we get you the hotspots as soon as possible please follow the below list of instructions.

- Visit the above link and select the option for "Request for Wi-Fi Hotspots"
- Download, complete, and upload the Hotspot Request Template, which will require:
  - ◊ Student ID
  - Student Name
  - ◊ Grade
  - ◊ Student Address
- Enter the Quantity needed
- Select the School Site to which hotspots will be delivered
- Provide your name and best phone number to reach you
- Provide the days and hours someone is *regularly* on-site and able to accept delivery
- Make sure to attach the file to the work order. If there is no file, it may cause delays
- **Important Note:** Each mobile hotspot can support at least five (5) connections so we are limiting one device per household as we have a the limited quantity of hotspots currently available.
