■ SAT

What is the SAT:

The SAT is a globally recognized college admission test that lets you show colleges what you know and how well you can apply that knowledge. Almost all colleges and universities use the SAT to make admission decisions.

When to take it:

The SAT and other College Board tests are offered several times a year. Most students take the SAT for the first time during the spring of their junior year and a second time during the fall of their senior year.

■ When is is offer:

The SAT is offered seven times each year in the U.S. and six times internationally. It is offered in October, November, December, January, March (U.S. only; SAT only), May and June.

■ What is the ACT:

■ By taking the ACT, you make yourself visible to colleges and scholarship agencies, so it's another way to help you get ready for life after high school.

■ When to take it:

■ Pick a test date that is at least two months ahead of the application deadlines of all the colleges and scholarship agencies you might want to apply to.

■ When is it offer:

■ The ACT is offered 6 times a year in the U.S. (September, October, December, February, April and June)




