Elementary Literacy Assessment Windows 2019-2020

Every elementary student needs a literacy assessment 3x/year. The assessment must be DIBELS 8 for all students K-2, English Learners and Students with Disability. Non-EO and non-SWD students in Grades 3-5 may be assessed with the Text Reading Comprehension (TRC) assessment in lieu of DIBELS 8. All K-2, English Learners, and/or SWD may be assessed with TRC as an optional additional assessment.

By refocusing classroom grading, assessment, instruction, and lesson planning on clear learning targets, and by implementing research-based systems honoring individual variation in learning styles, Mastery Learning and Grading allows more students to succeed academically.

Local District Mastery Learning and Grading coaches are available to facilitate the Professional Development Series at your school for twelve or more interested participants (applicable PK–12+, all content areas). This entails six, two-hour, in-person workshops scheduled approximately three weeks apart to allow participants time to reflect and engage in the eight hours of independent online learning. Upon completion of all in-person workshops and online learning, participants will earn MLG certification and be paid training rate for all hours completed beyond contracted work day.
