Grant Writing Modules Now Available

Interested in writing a grant, but not sure how to begin? The Division of Instruction has recently written three online modules focused on Grant Writing. Each module covers an element of the Grant Writing process. Module 1: A Grant Writing Guild; Module 2: Grant Application Process; Module 3: Key Components of a Grant Proposal. To access the modules:

- 1. Go to MyPLN
- 2. Sign in using your single sign-on
- Click on SEARCH
- 4. Type in the word "Grants" (on the global search) and click
- 5. You will see three modules (each module will give you specific information regarding grant writing)
- 6. Click on the module you wish to view (each module is between 8-15 minutes in length)

Middle School Intervention Programs for Math and ELA

The A-G team has developed intervention programs for 8th grade Math and ELA. Professional development is scheduled for September 25th at Beaudry with follow-up support provided by request. Each program provides a wealth of materials that increase mastery of key standards and skills.

- PASS-8 Math and ELA: Modular, flexibly-paced programs built around grade-level learning targets designed to mirror the successful high school PASS programs.
- STAR-8 Math and ELA: Eight-day modular programs structured into two-hour block lessons, with all required supporting materials. Curricula are designed to re-engage students in core subjects and increase academic mastery.
