Warning Notices for Reporting Period 1

<u>Warning notices</u> must be provided from September 28 – October 2, 2020, to students who are at risk of not meeting grade level standards. Teachers may provide the warning notice as a PDF via telephone or video conference, or as an email message to parents via Schoology or the Parent Portal. For parents who are unable to be contacted as described above, notices must be sent via the Elementary Warning Notice portal at <u>https://mailme.lausd.net</u>. Teachers must also log the warning notice date of delivery on the progress report screen in MiSiS.

Mark Reporting Guidelines

L.A. Unified will implement the regular 1-4 grading scale for elementary students as outlined in BUL-2332.7 *Elementary School Progress Report Marking Practices and Procedures*, dated August 3, 2018. Students who have not participated in remote learning due to a circumstance beyond their control are not to be penalized. The LAS Links assessment assesses the core language domains of Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing. The Middle of the Year (MOY) testing window is from September 14 to October 16, 2020.

Instructional Technology Initiative (ITI)

Get Creative with Physical Computing

Learners will get creative with <u>physical computing</u>. This is an introduction to programming in a way that is approachable and inviting. This session will be using block-based Microsoft MakeCode language and JavaScript. This will be a two-hour synchronous session.

Mastery Learning and Grading (MLG)

Virtual Mastery Learning and Grading Professional Development

Virtual Mastery Learning and Grading PD available for school sites/individual educators. Mastery Learning and Grading is a growth-mindset approach to grading and instruction based on the understanding that everyone can learn with the right conditions and support. The PD series is facilitated by MLG coaches and entails six two-hour, synchronous workshops (Zoom), scheduled approximately two to three weeks apart to allow participants time to reflect and engage in the eight hours of asynchronous Schoology online learning. Upon completion of all workshops and online learning, participants will earn MLG certification. Training rate is available for all hours beyond the contracted day. MLG Certified Implementation Support

Mastery Learning and Grading Implementation Support sessions are available to MLG certified teachers. These are virtual, synchronous, beyond the bell opportunities to work on creating MLG classroom materials (learning targets, Schoology mastery gradebook set up, proficiency scales for learning targets, tiered assessments of learning targets, and MLG syllabi) with support, resources, and feedback provided by Local District MLG coaches. Digital Content Application Support

With the increased use of L.A. Unified approved digital content applications, teachers may contact the vendor directly for support. To access vendor support contact information, visit the LMS App Center at https://achieve.lausd.net/lmsappcenter.

Submission of Grades through Schoology

During Remote Learning, teachers may have added additional staff to their course(s). Additional staff may have been added as members of the course. During an open grading window, when teachers are using the Grade Passback screen to submit grades to MiSiS, any additional staff members in the course that are not part of the teacher's official MiSiS roster will cause the Grade Passback screen to return an error. This is the expected behavior and will not prevent student grades from flowing back to MiSiS. Upon submission of grades, teachers should run the MiSiS Teacher Verification of Marks report to confirm grades have successfully passed back to MiSiS.

Deleting of Courses

Schoology is integrated with MiSiS and will automatically update courses as schedule changes are made in MiSiS. <u>Manually</u> <u>deleting courses should NOT be done under any circumstance</u>. Doing so will have a negative impact on students and teachers in the course being deleted. If you are a member of a course and wish to be removed from it, inform the course administrator and have them remove you from the courses Members page. Do not go to your course list and delete the course manually. Deleting a course, yourself, deletes the course for everyone else as well.

Course Administrators can remove a member from a course with the following steps:

- 1. Go to the Members page
- 2. Click on the gear icon next to their name
- 3. Select Unenroll
