Grant and Competition Opportunities

California Credit Union Teacher Grant Program

California Credit Union is awarding 10 Teacher grants of \$500 each. The <u>Teacher Grant Program</u> is designed to assist educators in funding innovative learning opportunities for their students, including programs to support students during distance learning. Be sure to complete the questions that describe your project and click the "SUBMIT" button at the end. Applicants may not be eligible to win a second time, if they have already won in the same school year. Submissions are due no later than October 2, 2020. Winners will be notified via the credit union website on October 19, 2020.

Educators of America Grant

<u>MicroGrant Program for Educators and Teachers</u> provides grants to improve technological resources. Classroom technology grant applications are reviewed on a quarterly basis and responses are given accordingly.

2020 Census Activities for Students

The U.S. Census Bureau's <u>Statistics in Schools</u> (SIS) program provides free activities and resources for teachers to help bring statistics to life in the classroom and prepare students for a data-driven world. SIS is launching a series of new teaching materials about the 2020 Census including:

- 67 classroom activities
- Updated classroom maps with census statistics
- Three videos for students in grades K-12
- A singalong song
- An activity book for children ages 2 to 5

With these materials, teachers can incorporate Census Bureau statistics into subjects such as <u>English language arts, math and</u> social studies. The materials are free and developed by educators and subject experts from across the country. Additionally, a <u>video for families</u> includes information about the purpose of, the types of questions used, and how to complete the 2020 Census.

California 2020 Census Activities for Students

Education partners are critical to helping the U.S. Census Bureau reach <u>hard-to-count Californians</u>. Historically, children have been an undercounted population in our state. To help us count every child, we must involve parents, teachers, and administrators. Mastery Grading and Learning (MGL)

Virtual Mastery Learning and Grading Salary Point Classes

Mastery Learning and Grading is a growth-mindset approach to grading and instruction based on the understanding that everyone can learn when given the right conditions and support. Our salary point course provides participants with additional time and resources in order to take a deeper dive into the key components of Mastery Learning and Grading and how to implement it in the classroom. Mastery Learning and Grading Salary Point Classes meet virtually on six Saturdays for two and a half hours, and also include thirty hours of asynchronous online learning. Participants who successfully complete the course requirements will earn one Salary Point Credit and MLG certification. To enroll on MyPLN, search key words "mastery salary point."

Virtual Mastery Learning and Grading PD

Mastery Learning and Grading is a growth-mindset approach to grading and instruction based on the understanding that everyone can learn when given the right conditions and support. <u>The PD series</u> is facilitated by MLG coaches and entails six two-hour, synchronous workshops (Zoom), scheduled approximately two to three weeks apart to allow participants time to reflect and engage in the eight hours of asynchronous online learning (Schoology course). Upon completion of all workshops and online learning, participants will earn MLG certification. Training rate is available for all hours beyond the contracted day.
