Grant Opportunity

The McCarthey Dressman Education Foundation Teacher Development Grant

The McCarthey Dressman Education Foundation Teacher Development Grant support small teams of teachers in the formation and implementation of groundbreaking K-12 classroom instruction. The grants provide opportunities for teachers to integrate fresh strategies that encourage critical inquiry and to observe their effects on students. Teachers have the opportunity to reflect and write about their projects, as well as to share their results with other teachers. The Foundation awards grants to individuals in amounts up to \$10,000 per year for a maximum of \$30,000 over three years, provided the eligibility requirements continue to be met. The application system closes when 350 submissions are reached. Submissions are accepted January 15 – April 15.
