Grant Writing Modules Now Available

Interested in writing a grant, but not sure how to begin? The Division of Instruction (DOI) has recently written three online modules focused on Grant Writing. Each module covers a particular element of the Grant Writing process. *Module 1: A Grant Writing Guide, Module 2: Grant Application Process*, and *Module 3: Key Components of a Grant Proposal* are accessible on MyPLN. To access the modules:

- 1. Go to MyPLN
- 2. Sign in using your single sign-on
- 3. Click on SEARCH
- 4. Type in the word "Grants" (on the global search) and click
- 5. You will see 3 modules (each module will give you specific information regarding grant writing)
- 6. Click on the module you wish to view (each module is between 8-15 minutes in length)

Summer Reading

Research has consistently shown students can lose an average of one month of school learning over summer vacation. By reading just five books over the summer, students can prevent that learning loss. According to Harvard professor Jimmy Kim, "The benefits of reading books during summer vacation were also consistent for all ethnic groups. In particular, reading four to five books had significantly larger effects than reading three or fewer books."
