Grant Opportunities

2020 Voya Unsung Heroes Program

More than 1,000 K–12 educators and their schools across the nation have funded innovative classroom projects through awards totaling nearly \$5 million from the <u>Voya Unsung Heroes Program</u>. Each year, 50 educators are selected to receive \$2,000 to help fund these projects, and three are chosen to receive the top awards of an additional \$5,000, \$10,000, or \$25,000. DonorsChoose Teams Up With Ten Districts
