

Students - youth placed in foster homes with an open dependency court case

Schools - School-Site Foster Care Advocates, Local Districts, school administrators, office staff, teachers, and school support staff

Community agencies - organizations involved in the supervision, care and support of foster youth

Caregivers - foster parents, relative caregivers and biological parents



Program Services

- Provide comprehensive academic assessments
- Advocate for the educational rights of foster youth
- Coordinate services for foster youth
- Collaborate with school programs and community agencies
- Participate in multi-disciplinary educational meetings
- Develop goals and provide interventions
- Refer to District and community resources
