



Master Schedule

Sections are the foundation for attendance taking and grade posting. A section consists of teacher(s), student(s), location, course(s), and meeting patterns. Below are the changes included in DACE-SIS:

Major Highlights

1. Courses

- Current business process remain as is.
- Added capability to capture additional Course Information in DACE-SIS
 - a. Pathways
 - b. Competencies
 - c. Max credits allowed

2. Calendar

- Added capability to have multiple calendars for a given school and school year
Example: Clinical days for nursing course can be setup differently from main school calendar.

3. Sections

- Multiple sections can be linked to ease enrollment and tracking
Example: Health Information Technology and Certified Nursing Assistant
- Section Attributes are available in DACE-SIS
 - a. Indicators for IET (Integrated Educational Training), FSI (Family Success Initiative), Pre-Apprenticeship, Burlington, external funding sources, and attendance exclusion.
- Forums
 - a. Multiple courses can be added at the same time
 - b. Forum Titles text field will be a dropdown list
- IET
 - a. Capability of supporting different methods of instructional delivery
- Co-teaching
 - a. Team teaching functionality is now replaced by co-teachers with advanced features like
 - i. Partial co-teaching
 - ii. Setting up section permissions for co-teachers
- Substitutes
 - a. Substitute teachers can now take attendance in DACE-SIS without applying for user access.
 - b. Substitute teachers will not be able to enter grades in DACE-SIS.
- Student's can be scheduled in a section or withdrawn from a section in mass.
