TASK

Operation of a pole saw. Only qualified tree surgeons may use this tool.

* Additional training and PPE may be required depending upon the scope of the activities.

	IASK	HAZAKDS	CONTROLS
1.	Equipment inspection	Lacerations	Inspect for damaged or loose components.
		Electrocution	Ensure the blade is securely attached to the pole.
			Visually inspect the blade to ensure it appears sharp.
			Pole pruner – ensure the spring is functioning properly. If the blade does not return to the open position a dab of oil, cleaning or deburring may be required.
2.	Preparing for work	Impact	Put on PPE.
		Laceration	Demarcate the work area.
		Fall	Tree workers shall not carry hand tools and equipment in their hands unless they are tools used to assist them in their climbing.
			Never throw the saw into a tree, out of a tree or between workers aloft.
			Maintain safe distance between employees while using the tree pruner.
			If blade is loose, tighten the wing nut to ensure the blade is secured in the open position.
3.	Operating equipment	Laceration	Maintain a stable, balanced position while operating the saw.
		Fall	Never stand under the branch being cut.
			Plan for and maintain an exit route to avoid impacts from falling limbs.
