As the second largest school district in the nation and the second largest employer in L.A. county that services Pre-K to Adult Education students, the top priority for the Division of District Operations is the safety of our students and staff. We work closely with schools, local districts and central offices to coordinate response to schools during incidents on a daily basis. Our efforts also include collaboration with the Los Angeles School Police Department, local agencies and first responders.

The Incident System Tracking Accountability Report (iSTAR), is an electronic tool that facilitates our response, informs our practice, and assists in effective communication when incidents arise. The reporting system captures events that affect the District, its students, employees, and surrounding communities. With collaboration between schools and offices, authorized users and administrators of iSTAR can together achieve a more precise data set and assess trends that lead to improved processes and services to the school community at large.

We thank the principals, administrators, teachers and all school and non-school based support staff for their successful collaboration and continued support in helping us keep LA Unified safe!




