STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS

As of fall 2023, English and 154 languages are spoken by students at Los Angeles Unified schools. Los Angeles Unified has 83,923 students who are learning to speak English proficiently. The primary languages spoken by students other than English are Spanish (88% of English learners), Armenian (2%), Russian (2%), Korean (1%), Filipino/Tagalog (1%), Farsi (1%), Arabic, Vietnamese, Bengali, K'iche' (a Mayan language of Guatemala), Cantonese, and other languages each accounting for less than 1% of the total.

Approximately 86 percent of the 2024-25 Los Angeles Unified General Fund comes from the state and serves as the primary operating fund for the K-12 program. These dollars pay for expenses such as:

DID YOU KNOW?

- Los Angeles Unified is the nation's second-largest school district.
- There are 333 magnet programs available for K-12 students. Themes include Career and Social Entrepreneurship, Center for Enriched Studies, Gifted and Highly Gifted, Liberal Arts, New Media, STEM and Visual and Performing Arts.
- Dual Language Education (DLE) programs are offered in Arabic, Armenian, French, Korean, Mandarin, Japanese and Spanish. In SY 2024-25, a total of 235 DLE programs will be offered across school communities. In addition to these languages in DLE, World Languages and Cultures (WLC) courses are also offered in American Sign Language, Filipino, German, Hebrew, Italian, Russian, and Spanish for a total of 13 languages. Los Angeles Unified's DLE programs and WLC courses strengthen the multilingual journey of students and families.
- Los Angeles Unified maintains 19 Wellness Centers, operated by Federally-Qualified Health Centers with mental health services provided by LAUSD or county mental health providers, two School Enrollment Placement and Assessment (SEPA) Centers, 10 School-Based Health Centers, and 16 LAUSD run clinics which are on-campus clinics that provide services directly to students and families.
